Advice Letter No. 1864

CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY (U 60 W)

To The Public Utilities Commission of the State of California:

California Water Service Company (Cal Water) hereby transmits for filing changes in its tariffs applicable to its CHICO, EAST LOS ANGELES, LIVERMORE, LOS ALTOS, MID-PENINSULA, SALINAS, STOCKTON, AND VISALIA service areas as shown in Attachment 1 and four copies of each are attached hereto.

Summary

This Advice Letter files the adopted tariffs in today's decision in A.07-07-001 (D.08-07-00x)¹. Under GO-96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1, this is a tier 1 filing. Cal Water proposes to make this advice letter effective today pending the Commission's determination of compliance. The Decision authorizes the following increases in dollars and percent of present rates:

Background

Ordering Paragraph 18 of the decision states:

18. Cal Water is authorized to file in accordance with General Order 96 B, and to make effective on filing, tariffs containing the 2008/2009 test year increases for its Eight Districts. The revised rates shall apply to service rendered on and after the tariff's effective date.

In addition, in order to properly implement the WRAM/MCBA mechanism adopted in D.08-02-036, Cal Water proposes changes to its preliminary statement M that reflect the quantities and rate design adopted in the decision.

Requested Effective Date

This is a Tier 1 filing, effective today pending the Division of Water and Audit's determination that it complies with Ordering Paragraph 18 of today's decision, that it properly proposes the adopted tariffs and that the adopted quantities are correctly stated.

Notice

In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rule 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on July 11, 2008 to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification. A list of those utilities and/or parties is attached.

Notice is not required under the General Order.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Division of Water and Audits, within the 20 day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20 day comment period.

Replies: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response.
