Advice Letter No. 1966

CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY (U 60 W)

To The Public Utilities Commission of the State of California:

California Water Service Company (Cal Water) hereby transmits for filing the changes in its tariff schedules shown on Attachment 1 for eight of its districts and four copies of each are attached hereto.

Summary

This filing complies with ordering paragraphs 1 and 2 of D.09-02-025. Cal Water is filing this Tier 2 Advice Letter to recover the amount of \$10,751, including interest, paid to Arthur A. Mangold for his contribution to D.08-07-008. Cal Water is requesting that this advice letter be effective January 15, 2010 to facilitate inputs to the utility billing system.

Background

Arthur A. Mangold (Mangold) is a Cal Water customer of the Mid-Peninsula district and chose to participate to the CPUC's decision regarding the 2007 General Rate Case. The CPUC found that Mangold both provided a substantial contribution to D.08-07-008 and qualified for compensation for said contribution.

Discussion

Cal Water is complying with ordering paragraphs 1 and 2 of D.09-02-025, which state:

1. Claimant is awarded \$ 10,560.
2. Within 30 days of the effective date of this decision, California Water Service Company shall pay Claimant the total award. Payment of the award shall include interest at the rate earned on prime, three-month commercial paper as reported in Federal Reserve Statistical Release H.15, beginning November 26, 2008, the 75th day after the filing of claimant's request, and continuing until full payment is made.

On April 3, 2009 and April 16, 2009, Cal Water paid \$10,560 plus an additional \$150 in interest to Arthur Mangold. Because Mr. Mangold contributed to the 2007 General Rate Case, the recovery should be spread across the 2007 GRC districts. Cal Water is



proposing to implement a one-time surcharge by dividing the total amount by the total number of services for the eight districts adopted in D.08-07-008.

Requested Effective Date

Under General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1, this would be a Tier 1 advice letter. Cal Water requests this advice letter to be classified as Tier 2 with a later effective date of January 15, 2010.

Notice

This advice letter is filed in compliance with Standard Practice U-08-W. No customer notice is required. In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rule 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on December 16, 2009 to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Division of Water and Audits, within the 20 day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20 day comment period.

Replies: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response.
