#### 1. WRAM/MCBA Surcharges and Surcredits

The purpose of the Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanisms (WRAMs) and Modified Cost Balancing Accounts (MCBAs) (together, WRAM/MCBA) is to track water revenues and production-related costs as part of a comprehensive conservation framework adopted by the Commission and implemented in 2008. The net balance in a WRAM/MCBA account represents an over-collection or under-collection of the revenues authorized by the Commission.

Each year, the "net" WRAM/MCBA balance for an area is "amortized," meaning that surcharges or credits are applied to customer bills to bring the balance back to zero.

The "WRAM surcharge" for Industrial, Recycled, Recycled Retrofit, and Agricultural Irrigation metered customers is a charge that is applied to each 100 cubic feet (or Ccf) of water usage. For other customers, the WRAM surcharge is suspended as of May 31, 2024.

#### 2. Interim Rate Memo Account True-up

Due to the delay in setting final rates approved in D. 24-03-042, the Commission authorized interim rates for a period of 17 months from January 1, 2023, through May 31, 2024 (Interim Period). The surcharges below reflect the difference between the interim rates on customers' bills since January 1, 2023, and the final rates that would have been in effect during the 17-month Interim Period.

A. <u>All Customers (except Private Fire Protection and Private Fire Hydrant services)</u> – For metered customers, a surcharge (per 100 Cubic Feet, or CCF) will be applied based on water usage. For flat rate customers, a fixed surcharge per month will be applied to each service. These surcharges will be in effect for a period of 12, 24, 26, 36, or 42 months, depending upon the district.

<u>Additional Coast Springs Surcharge</u> – For all customers in the Coast Springs area (part of the Bay Area Region), the surcharge per CCF identified below will be in effect for all usage that exceeds 2 CCF per month (i.e., for 3 CCF and higher).

5. ICBA Surcharges (N)

There are Incremental Cost Balancing Accounts (ICBAs) associated with three aspects of producing water: purchasing water from wholesale providers, paying the power costs needed to produce water, and paying fees for pumping water. The rates for these activities are established by third parties and are not within Cal Water's control. When third parties change their rates, the resulting changes in the cost of producing water are tracked in the appropriate ICBA.

For 2024, the balances in the three ICBAs have been netted to one amount for each area identified below. Under-collections are amortized through a quantity-based (per CCF) surcharge, and overcollections are amortized through fixed monthly credits. These surcharges and credits are applied to all metered customers.

#### 3. Chromium-6 Treatment, Lead Service Line Inventories, and the General Balancing Account

(N)

In Decision 24-03-042, the Commission authorized Cal Water to amortize the balances in the following regulatory balancing and memo accounts by applying surcharges or credits to customers' bills.

In the "Chromium-6 Treatment Account," Cal Water tracked the costs spent to treat water for the odorless and tasteless metallic element, chromium-6, long-term exposure to which is believed to be carcinogenic and harmful to public health. The cost to be recovered from the Dixon District is \$65,957 and from the Willows District is \$84,765.

In the "Lead Service Line Account," Cal Water tracked the costs spent to inventory and plan for the replacement of water lines that may contain lead, another contaminant harmful to public health. The amount to be recovered across all ratemaking areas is \$293,318.

The "General Balancing Account" for each ratemaking area tracks small dollar amounts left over after other accounts have been amortized, and aggregates them for later amortization when the balances grow large. Residual balances were left over after five (5) accounts had been amortized. The amount to be recovered from each ratemaking area is listed below, for a total net amount of \$210,548.

#### 4. M-WRAM Surcharges and Surcredits

The purpose of the Monterey-Style Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (M-WRAM) is to track the difference between actual quantity revenues collected from residential customers who have a tiered rate structure, and the quantity revenues that would have been collected if a single quantity rate (i.e., a uniform rate) had been in effect in that area. This comparison is done by multiplying the actual amount of water used by the uniform rate authorized by the Commission.

Because there was an under-collection of revenues tracked in the M-WRAM Balancing Account in calendar years 2023 and 2024, a surcharge is applied to each 100 cubic feet (CCF) of water used by residential metered customers in those areas that had tiered quantity rates as shown below.
