RESIDENTIAL FLAT RATE SERVICE

APPLICABILITY

Applicable to all flat rate residential water service.

TERRITORY

Bakersfield and vicinity, Kern County.

RATES

For a single-family residential unit, including premises having the following areas:

6,000 sq. ft., or less	\$96.16	(I)
6,001 to 10,000 sq. ft.	\$110.70	
10,001 to 16,000 sq. ft.	\$138.05	
16,001 to 25,000 sq. ft.	\$175.04	
For each additional single-family residential unit on the same premises and served from the same service connection	\$67.64	(I)

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. The above flat rates apply to service connections not larger than one inch in diameter.
2. All service not covered by the above classifications shall be furnished only on a metered basis.
3. For service covered by the above classifications, if the utility or the customer so elects, a meter shall be installed and service provided under Schedule No. SL-1-R, Residential Metered Service.
4. This Schedule is closed to all new connections as of May 8, 1991, the effective date of Tariff Sheet No. 4133-W.
5. All bills are subject to the following tariff schedules: **Schedule UF** (CPUC reimbursement fee) and applicable surcharges and surcredits on **Schedule RSF** (Rate Support Fund), **Schedule CAP** (Customer Assistance Program), and **Schedule AS** (Additional Surcharges and Surcredits).
6. Qualifying low-income individually metered residential customers are eligible for credits as shown on **Schedule CAP**.

- 7. **Power Expense Increase:** Beginning on July 31, 2023, rates in this area will reflect a 5.5% revenue increase (as compared to the revenue approved in Advice Letter 2433) due to higher charges by Pacific Gas and Electric Company. This generally caused flat rates to go up between \$5.31 and \$9.66. Amounts collected from this flat rate increase will be tracked in a balancing account, as required by Section 792.5 of the Public Utilities Code.
