Summary

This advice letter requests approval for a rate increase, with a requested effective date of April 15, 2018, for the costs associated with the following capital projects in the Bay Area Region:

- a) PID 99296: Security windows in new operations/customer service center;
- b) PID 63402: Office furniture in new operations/customer service center; and
- c) PID 20141: Designing and equipping of a 4 million gallon storage tank at Station 27 (Beresford-San Mateo).

Background

The Commission adopted a Settlement Agreement and resolved Cal Water's 2015 General Rate Case in D.16-12-042.¹ As described in the introduction to the Plant Chapter for each district, the Settlement Agreement identifies capital projects that will not be included in new rates, but that may be recovered through an advice letter after the project is in service, up to a specified capped dollar amount. The list of approved projects that may be filed as "rate base offsets" is in Attachment 3 to the Settlement Agreement.

Water Industry Rule 7.3.3(8) specifies that a rate base offset may be a Tier 2 filing if it meets the following requirements:

- (i) The rate base offset was previously approved by the Commission in a decision or resolution
- (ii) The project scope is consistent with what the Commission approved
- (iii) The Commission approval included a budget cap and the rate base offset request is at or below the budget cap.

Discussion

Project PID 99296: The security windows in Bayshore Operations and Customer Service Center, is authorized as an advice letter project up to a capital cost of \$203,510. The final cost of the project at closing is \$104,791. In this advice letter, Cal Water requests recovery up to the project's closing cost of \$104,791.

Project 63402 is related to the office furniture in the Bayshore Operations and Customer Service Center and is authorized as an advice letter project up to a capital cost of \$204,000. The final cost of the project at closing is \$446,207. In this advice letter, Cal Water requests recovery up to the cap amount of \$204,000. This project was intented to purchase the furniture needed for the new Operations and Commercial Office bayshore building.

Project 20141 is for a 4 million gallon (MG) storage tank at Station 27 in San Mateo (Beresford). This project has been authorized as an advice letter project up to a capital project cost of \$2,403,200. The final cost of the project is \$8,697,687.² In this advice letter, Cal Water requests recovery up to the cap amount of \$2,403,200.

- This project was originally proposed in the 2009 GRC to construct a 2.5 MG tank. In the 2012 GRC, Cal Water informed the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) that the costs to mitigate site constraints were much more than expected. Cal Water indicated that the best way to maximize the value of the site and to address the Bayshore District's storage capacity deficiency was to build a larger tank than originally contemplated.
- Because ORA did have a chance to review the modified project for reasonableness and cost
 effectiveness, ORA did not support putting the costs of the project into rates, but instead
 agreed to authorize it as an advice letter project with a \$2,203,200 cost cap.
- Cal Water began the design and permitting of the tank. Cal Water settled on a 3.86 MG pre-stressed concrete tank as the optimal size for the site. Additional reinforcement was added to the tank beyond a traditional pre-stressed concrete tank due to the close proximity to earthquake faults.
- The project was included again in the 2015 GRC filing. Cal Water and the ORA agreed to an advice letter with a \$2,403,200 cap. The project was awarded to the lowest qualified bidder. This bid alone was significantly higher than the advice letter cap. The project

experienced some delays and cost increases in construction, primarily due to unstable soil conditions which had not been apparent in the geotechnical investigation. However, at the end of 2017, Cal Water was able to fill the tank and provide benefit to the community in the form of additional operational, emergency storage and fire protection.

Total Request: The total additional revenue requested for the three projects is \$403,746, or 0.46%. The bill impact of this request on a residential customer with 6 CCF of water usage per month (the recorded average monthly residential usage in 2017) will be an increase of approximately \$0.28, or 0.50%. The details relating to the calculations for the above amounts are contained in work papers.

Requested Effective Date

Cal Water requests that the proposed tariffs in this advice letter become effective April 15, 2018.

Notice

Customer Notice – Individual customer notice of this advice letter is not required under General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 3.1, because the requested rate increase is an offset of less than 10% of the district's revenue requirement.

Service Lists – In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rule 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on March 15, 2018 to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or



(6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period. Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

Replies

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at (408) 367-8200.
