To the California Public Utilities Commission:

California Water Service Company ("Cal Water") respectfully submits this Tier 1 advice letter requesting authority to make the following changes in the tariff schedules applicable to all Class A districts (excludes Grand Oaks).

Summary

This Tier 2 advice letter requests authority to implement new rates for its 20 Class A ratemaking areas **beginning July 1, 2018**. The new rates reflect revenue decreases stemming from two federal tax law changes adopted in the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act ("TCJA") and from the Commission's reduction of Cal Water's rate of return from 7.94% to 7.48% adopted in D.18-03-035.

In addition, the new rates reflect revenue increases requested in <u>nine</u> pending advice letters for purchased water/pump tax offsets and/or rate base offsets. One rate base offset (for SCADA improvements to Customer Support Services) results in a slight revenue increase for all 20 Class A ratemaking areas. The remaining eight advice letters are specific to one or more of the following ratemaking areas: Bay Area Region, Bear Gulch District, Dominguez District, Hermosa Redondo District, Los Altos District, and Los Angeles County Region.

The net impacts of all revenue changes described above are <u>rate decreases</u> for all areas except the Los Altos District.

Finally, Cal Water requests the elimination of the tariff for Residential Flat-Rate customers in the Marysville District because all residential customers are now metered.

Background

In December 2017, the federal "Tax Cuts and Jobs Act" ("TCJA") lowered the corporate tax rate from 35% to 21%, eliminated the Domestic Production Activities Deduction ("DPAD"), and

¹ The TCJA also repealed the Section 199 Domestic Production Activities Deduction ("DPAD"), which had provided a tax deduction for income from "qualified production activities" in the U.S., including activities related to water production. In the Net-to-Gross calculations in Cal Water's workpapers, this deduction has historically been reflected

adopted other changes to federal tax laws. In March 2018, the Commission approved a decrease in Cal Water's rate of return from 7.94% to 7.48% in D.18-03-035.

Cal Water filed Tier 2 advice letters on March 15, 2018 for three rate base offsets in the Bay Area Region ("BAR"), the Bear Gulch District ("BG"), and the Hermosa Redondo District ("HR"), respectively, and one rate base offset for Customer Support Services ("CSS") that impacts all Class A ratemaking areas. While Cal Water requested an effective date of April 15, 2018, all four advice letters have been suspended.

Cal Water filed Tier 1 advice letters on May 23, 2018 for three purchased water/pump tax offsets for Los Angeles County Region ("LAR"), HR, and the Dominguez District ("DOM"), respectively, and filed one Tier 2 advice letter for a rate base offset in LAR. Cal Water filed one additional Tier 1 advice letter for a purchased water/pump tax offset in the Los Altos District ("LAS"). Cal Water requested an effective date of July 1, 2018 for all five advice letters.

On May 8, 2018, the Water Division sent a letter to All Class A Water Utilities with the subject line "Implementation of the 2018 Federal Corporate Tax Rate of 21%" ("5/18/18 WD Letter"). For Cal Water, the 5/18/18 WD Letter indicated that the federal corporate tax rate decrease should be:

Included as part of a Tier 2 advice letter to be filed in May 2018 implementing the cost of capital decision, D.18-03-035 and made effective with several currently pending rate base offset filings on or before July 1, 2018.

Discussion

Consistent with the 5/18/18 WD Letter discussed above, this Tier 2 filing proposes new rates for all 20 of Cal Water's Class A ratemaking areas to reflect the decrease in the corporate tax rate from 35% to 21%, the elimination of the Domestic Production Activities Deduction ("DPAD"),² and the decrease in Cal Water's rate of return from 7.94% to 7.48%. In addition, the new rates assume approval of the following outstanding advice letters:

- 1) AL 2296 for a Bay Area Region rate base offset (filed 3/15/18 and suspended);
- 2) AL 2297 for a Bear Gulch District rate base offset (filed 3/15/18 and suspended);
- AL 2298 for a Hermosa Redondo District rate base offset in the (filed 3/15/18 and suspended);
- 4) AL 2299 for a Customer Support Services rate base offset applicable to all Class A ratemaking areas (filed 3/15/18 and suspended);
- 5) AL 2305 for an Los Angeles County Region purchased water offset (filed 5/23/18 and pending);
- 6) AL 2306 for an Los Angeles County Region rate base offset (filed 5/23/18 and pending);

as the line item called the "American Jobs Creation Act." In the workpapers for this advice letter, the value for that line item is now 0%.

- 7) AL 2307 for a Hermosa Redondo District purchased water and pump tax offset (filed 5/23/18 and pending);
- 8) AL 2308 for a Dominguez District purchased water and pump tax offset (filed 5/23/18 and pending), and;
- 9) AL 2309 for a Los Altos District purchased water and pump tax offset (filed 5/25/18 and pending).

The "Cost of Capital" and "2018 Tax Accounting" Memorandum Accounts

On December 29, 2017, Cal Water filed AL 2292 to open a new memorandum account (the "2018 Tax Accounting Memo Account") to capture the impacts of the TCJA on rates beginning January 1, 2018. On March 30, 2018, Cal Water filed AL 2300 to open a new memorandum account (the "Cost of Capital Memo Account") to capture the impacts of the Commission's decision, D.18-03-035, on rates beginning January 1, 2018.

In future advice letters, Cal Water will request amortization of these memo accounts for the period of January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018. In addition, amortization of the 2018 Tax Accounting Memo Account will reflect other federal tax law changes adopted in the TCJA (those not noted in this advice letter) that impact rates after June 30, 2018, as appropriate.

Elimination of Marysville Residential Flat Tariff

Pursuant to General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.2(10), Cal Water requests the elimination of the tariff for Residential Flat-Rate customers in the Marysville District because all residential customers are now metered.

The revised tariff sheets and Preliminary Statement M for each ratemaking area accurately reflect the proposed rate impact. The workpapers associated with this filing will be provided to Water Division staff in accordance with Standard Practice U-27-W.

Authorization

Cal Water files this request as a Tier 2 advice letter consistent with the 5/18/18 WD Letter referenced above.

Requested Effective Date

Cal Water proposes that this advice letter become effective on **July 1, 2018**.

Notice

<u>Customer Notice</u>: The rate decreases requested in this advice letter do not require notice pursuant to General Order 96-B, General Rule 4.2 and Water Industry Rule 7.3.1. The revenue increases reflected in the calculations were properly requested and noticed in previous advice letters.

<u>Service List:</u> In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rules 4.3 and 7.2, and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on **May 29, 2018**



to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties requiring Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division within the 20-day protest period so a late-filed protest can be



entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

<u>Replies</u>: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at (408) 367-8200.
