Summary

This filing proposes a revenue increase of \$369,587 or 1% to reflect increases in purchased water and pump taxes in the East Los Angeles District. Cal Water requests an effective date of July 1, 2018 for this Tier 1 advice letter.

Discussion

Purchased water for the East Los Angeles District is obtained from the Central Basin Municipal Water District (Central Basin). Effective July 1, 2018, Central Basin has increased its quantity rates for Tier 1 from \$1,128 to \$1,150 per acre-foot. In addition, the Water Replenishment District of Southern California will increase its pump tax rate for potable water from \$318 per acre feet to \$339 per acre feet effective from July 1, 2018.

Because the cost of purchased water offset is variable in nature, Cal Water has recalculated rates by applying 100% of the increase to the quantity rates. Corresponding changes are made to the WRAM/MCBA mechanism adopted in D.08-02-036.

Each residential tier has been increased by the same percentage to keep the adopted tier ratios intact. However, as compared to rates currently in effect (until June 31, 2018), customers will see a net decrease in rates because Cal Water has proposed that the revenue offsets from the updated cost of capital and TCJA compliance filing in Advice Letter 2310 also go into effect on July 1st. The revenue "increase" discussed in this advice letter therefore uses AL 2310 as the initial comparison



point. The rate “decrease” discussed in this advice letter, however, uses AL 2287-A as the initial comparison point.¹

More details have been provided in discussion below. Based on current rates in effect as approved in AL 2287-A, residential customers will see a decrease in quantity rates by **(-\$0.0817)/CCF** for Tier 1 usage, and by **(-\$0.1005)/CCF** for Tier 2 usage. Nonresidential quantity rates will decrease by **(-\$0.0903)/CCF** relative to current rates. Recycled water quantity rates will decrease by **(-\$0.0609)/CCF** relative to current rates.

The typical residential customer using 12 CCF (average residential usage in 2017) will see a **(-\$1.26)** or **-1.8%**, monthly decrease in their water bill. The details relating to the calculations for the above amounts are contained in work papers.

Impact of Pending Cost of Capital compliance/TCJA Implementation AL Request:

On May 29, 2018, Cal Water filed AL 2310 to reflect revenue decreases stemming from two federal tax law changes adopted in the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (“TCJA”) and from the Commission’s reduction of Cal Water’s rate of return from 7.94% to 7.48% adopted in D.18-03-035. Cal Water has requested that the proposed rates in AL 2310 will be effective on July 1, 2018. With this expectation, the rates in this Tier 1 advice letter reflect the rate changes proposed in AL 2310.

The revised tariff sheets and Preliminary Statement M accurately reflect the proposed rate impact. The Commission staff will be provided the work papers associated to this filing in accordance with Standard Practice U-27-W.

Requested Effective Date

Under General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1, as modified by Resolution W-4664, this is a Tier 1 advice letter. Cal Water requests that the rates proposed in this advice letter become effective on July 1, 2018.

Notice

Customer Notice – Customer notice of Tier 1 advice letters is not required under General Order 96-B, General Rule 7.3.1.

Service Lists – In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rule 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on June 15, 2018 to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A

protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

Replies:

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be



served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at 408/367-8200.

4. **Water Expense Increase:** Beginning on or after July 1, 2018, an increase in purchased water costs of \$0.0515/CCF for Tier 1 usage, and \$0.0634/CCF for Tier 2 usage, and an associated increase in total revenue of 1% (relative to the costs and revenues approved in AL 2310) are being tracked in a balancing account as required by Section 792.5 of the Public Utilities Code.
