Summary

This filing proposes a revenue increase of \$570,200 or 1.1% to reflect increases in purchased water in the Los Angeles County Region. Cal Water requests an effective date of January 1, 2019 for this Tier 1 advice letter.

Discussion

Purchased water for the Palos Verdes area (a sub-region of the Los Angeles County Region), is obtained from the West Basin Municipal Water District (West Basin). Effective January 1, 2019, West Basin will increase its quantity charges for Tier 1 from \$1,354/AF to \$1,385/AF.

Because purchased water offset costs are variable in nature, Cal Water has recalculated rates by applying 100% of the increase to the quantity rates. Corresponding changes are made to the WRAM/MCBA mechanism adopted in D.08-02-036.

Each residential tier has been increased by the same percentage to keep the adopted tier ratios intact. Residential customer will have quantity rates increase by \$0.0691/CCF for Tier 1 usage, by \$0.0733/CCF for Tier 2 usage, and by \$0.0878/CCF for Tier 3 usage. Nonresidential quantity rates



will increase by \$0.0742/CCF relative to current rates.¹ Recycled water quantity rates will increase by \$0.0537/CCF.

The typical residential customer using 19 CCF will see an increase of \$1.33, or 1.2%, in their monthly water bill. The details relating to the calculations for the above amounts are contained in work papers.

The revised tariff sheets and Preliminary Statement M accurately reflect the proposed rate impact. The Commission staff will be provided the work papers associated to this filing in accordance with Standard Practice U-27-W.

Tariff Correction – It has come to Cal Water’s attention that the residential and non-residential tariffs for the Los Angeles County Region should indicate that there are two areas, Fremont Valley and Lake Hughes, in which customers receive bi-monthly bills. An additional Special Condition has been added to the residential and non-residential tariffs to remedy this oversight. (Note that this is not relevant to the Reclaimed Water tariff, which by its terms do not apply to customers in the Fremont Valley and Lake Hughes areas.)

Requested Effective Date

Under General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1, as modified by Resolution W-4664, this is a Tier 1 advice letter. Cal Water requests that the rates proposed in this advice letter become effective on **January 1, 2019**.

Notice

Customer Notice: This is a Tier 1 advice letter that does not require customer notice, as provided in under Water Industry Rule 7.3.1.

Service List: In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rules 4.3 and 7.2, and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on November 5, 2018 to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;

- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties requiring Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division within the 20-day protest period so a late-filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

Replies: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response.
