#### **Summary**

This advice letter seeks to stop the Safe Drinking Water Bond Act (SDWBA) surcharges in the Rancho Del Paradiso service area of Bay Area Region (formerly the Bayshore and the Redwood Valley Districts) due to excess balances in the fiduciary account associated with the loan. Cal Water is also requesting to use the excess funds to pay off the loan, and refund the remaining funds to customers over twelve months. Details of the calculations are shown in the work papers.

#### **Historical Background**

In 1997, Cal Water entered into a loan agreement E51044 with the State of California Department of Health Services for a \$36,569.24 loan at a 7.40% interest rate for a term of 19 years. Cal Water is required to maintain an operating reserve in the SDWBA fiduciary accounts in accordance with loan contracts.

#### Discussion

In Cal Water's review of the current SDWBA loan balances, Cal Water determined that there is a sufficient balance in the fiduciary account associated with the loan to pay off the loan's remaining balance. As of December 31, 2018, the loan balance was \$1,743.02 and the current fiduciary balance was \$3,221.66. Addition revenues of approximately \$868 will be collected through current surcharges from January 1, 2019 thru March 31, 2019.

Based on the number of active customers in the Rancho Del Paradiso service area as of December 31, 2018, Cal Water calculates that a total refund amount of \$2,402 should be returned to

customer (via a fixed monthly credit per connection) as shown below, for a period of twelve months.

#### **Authorization for a Tier 1 Approval**

Cal Water submits this advice letter as a Tier 1 filing with the effective date of April 15, 2019 in compliance with General Order 96-B. No customer notice is required. In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rules 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on March 27, 2019 to competing and adjacent and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

#### **Response or Protest**

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions:
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period. Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

#### **Replies**

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at 408/367-8200.

#### SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- 1. Qualifying low-income individually metered residential customers are eligible for credits as shown on Schedule LIRA.
- 2. All bills are subject to the following tariff schedules: Schedule UF (CPUC reimbursement fee) and applicable surcharges and surcredits on Schedule RSF (Rate Support Fund), Schedule LIRA (Low-Income Ratepayer Assistance), and Schedule AS (Additional Surcharges and Surcredits).
- 3. Fire sprinkler rate: Any service to a residential customer not exceeding two units with a meter size that has a "fire sprinkler" rate (listed above) is eligible for that rate if: (a) the customer is paying for service where a residential fire sprinkler system is required/requested to be installed by local fire or building codes; (b) a smaller meter would be large enough to provide adequate service in the absence of the additional demand needed to supply water to the system; (c) the sprinkler system is served through the meter providing residential water service; and (d) the customer requests the "fire sprinkler" rate. The Company may seek verification that the above criteria are met. This service will be considered a general metered service, and not a fire service, so the rules and conditions for general metered service shall apply. Information specific to each area is below:

Bayshore and Redwood Valley-Lucerne - the fire sprinkler rate for 1-inch meters is provided above. Redwood Valley-Coast Springs and Unified - the fire sprinkler rate for 1-inch meters provided above is the 5/8 x 3/4-inch meter service charge plus a \$2.50 surcharge per month.

- 4. Capacity Surcharge for RWV-Coast Springs: Monthly bills with usage at and above 5 CCF will include a monthly capacity surcharge of \$20.00 per CCF
- 5. Safe Drinking Water Surcharges: The SDWBA (Safe Drinking Water Bond Act) and SDWSRF (Safe Drinking Water State Revolving Fund) surcharges are in addition to the water bill. This surcharge must be identified on each bill. The surcharge is specifically for the repayment of the loan authorized by the decision indicated below for each area: Coast Springs (D.06-04-031), Lucerne (D.89-09-002), and Rancho Del Paradiso (D.84-09-045) (eliminated 4/15/19).
