California Water Service Company ("Cal Water") respectfully submits this Tier 2 supplement advice letter for Dominguez Ratebase Offset and hereby transmits for filing the following changes in its tariff schedules applicable to its Dominguez District.

### **Summary**

This advice letter requests approval to change the effective date of the tariffs filed in Advice Letter 2353. Cal Water recently filed company-wide and district specific rate base offsets and purchased water offsets for several districts with a proposed effective date of February 1, 2020. Cal Water would like to reduce the number of rate changes by having one effective date for recently filed ratebase and purchased water offsets, and thus proposes to change the effective date of the tariffs approved in advice letter 2353 from January 1, 2020 to February 1, 2020.

### **Background**

Advice Letter 2353 requested a rate increase effective date of January, 1 2020 for the costs associated with Sta. 232 Upgrade (PID 76316) in Cal Water's "Dominguez" ratemaking area to address operational and structural issues related to booster suction and discharge piping, corrosiveness of the hydro-pneumatic tank and deterioration of vault structure in Sta. 232.

### Discussion



In the 2015 GRC, Commission authorized PID 76316 as an advice letter project for Dominguez for Sta. 232 for operational and structural improvements that could also address safety issues of the personnel and prevent any serious injuries or any life-threatening tragedy. The project scope included the installation of booster suction and discharge piping, pump station building, concrete pedestal, electrical upgrades and new hydro pneumatic tank/bladder tank.

The cost of the project was \$4,419,853, however Cal Water requests revenue recovery up to the capped amount of \$2,221,934. If approved, this would result in an annual revenue increase of \$300,760, or 0.4%. The typical residential customer using 10 CCF will see a monthly increase of \$0.22, or 0.4%, in their water bill.

### **Requested Effective Date**

Cal Water requests that the proposed tariffs in this advice letter become effective February 1, 2020.

### **Notice**

### Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or

(6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period. Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

### **Replies**

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response.
