California Water Service Company ("Cal Water") respectfully submits this Tier 1 advice letter requesting authority to make the following changes to tariffs applicable to all of the Cal Water's ratemaking areas except for the Travis District and Grand Oaks.

Purpose

With this advice letter, Cal Water requests authorization from the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to implement new rates for 20 Class A ratemaking areas effective February 1, 2020. The new rates reflect a consolidation of the changes requested in six Tier 1 advice letters for purchased water/pump tax offsets, and six Tier 2 advice letters for ratebase offsets, all of which request revenue increases.

Background

Cal Water filed Tier 1 advice letters on December 20, 2019 for six purchased water/pump tax offsets and six ratebase offsets for the ratemaking areas shown below.

Discussion

In advice letter (AL) 2358, Cal Water requested to consolidate all revenue increases related to all the filed purchased water and ratebase offsets as one increase to basic water rates (quantity charges and service charges) to avoid multiple rate increases for the same ratemaking area. This Tier 1 advice letter proposes new rates for 20 Cal Water ratemaking areas (excludes the Travis District and Grand Oaks) to reflect the revenue increases requested and approved in the advice letters identified above. Implementing one rate change to encompasses all advice letters relevant to an area helps to address customers' historically concerns about multiple rate increases.

The table below shows the monthly typical bill impacts using average usage for residential customers for all ratemaking areas.

Requested Effective Date

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation pursuant to Water Industry Rules SP U-08-W (F.24) and General Order 96-B because the underlying advice letters consolidated in this advice letter have been approved by the Water Division. Cal Water requests that the rates become effective on **February 1, 2020**.

Notice

<u>Customer Notice</u>: The rate decreases requested in this advice letter do not require notice pursuant to General Order 96-B, General Rule 4.2 and Water Industry Rule 7.3.1. The revenue increases reflected in the calculations were properly requested and noticed in previous advice letters.

<u>Service List:</u> In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rules 4.3 and 7.2, and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on **January 27**, **2020** to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties requiring Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division within the 20-day protest period so a late-filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

<u>Replies</u>: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response.
