To The Public Utilities Commission of the State of California:

California Water Service Company (“Cal Water”) respectfully submits this Tier 1 advice letter requesting authority to make the following changes to tariffs applicable to all of Cal Water’s Class A ratemaking areas except Travis (this also excludes Grand Oaks, a Class D area).

Summary

This advice letter is filed pursuant to the terms and conditions outlined in Preliminary Statement Z3- Conservation Expense One-Way Balancing Account 3 (CEBA3) adopted in D.16-12-042. Cal Water hereby requests to amortize the balances in the CEBA3 and requests authority to modify its tariff for Additional Surcredits/Surcharges (Schedule AS).

Discussion

In D.16-12-042 and the Settlement Agreement (Exhibit A to D.16-12-042) adopted therein, the Commission adopted a three-year conservation expense budget totaling \$21,923,298 for Cal Water’s 23 districts (to be expended over the rate case period of 2017-2019). The funds are not transferable between districts, but may be carried forward to subsequent years within each district.

Unspent Funds and Refunds: Cal Water was authorized to track conservation expenses by category thru Preliminary Statement Z3: Conservation Expense One-Way Balancing Account 3 (CEBA3). Section 4.b of Preliminary Statement Z3 requires Cal Water to file an advice letter by March 31, 2020 to refund the balances, and specifies the methods for the refunds, either through a one-time sur-credit, or a 12-month sur-credit.

Section 4 of Preliminary Statement Z3 states:

- b. If the total amount recorded in section 3.h. for any district as of December 31, 2019 is a positive number (meaning accumulated expenditures are less than the three-year authorization), Cal Water shall file an advice letter by March 31, 2020 to refund this amount to ratepayers. This refund should be made as a one-time conservation credit unless the average credit per customer exceeds 50% of the adopted monthly service charge for a residential 5/8 x 3/4-inch meter, in which case the credit should be made over a 12-month period.

At this time, in the absence of a final decision in A.18-07-001 (2018 GRC), Cal Water is complying with Section 4(b) of Preliminary Statement Z3, which requires Cal Water to file an advice letter for conservation refunds by “March 31, 2020.”

No other expenses can be booked to the CEBA for activities after December 31, 2019, so the end balances for each district are known, and will not change except to reflect additional interest. In an abundance of caution, and because these are known amounts owed to ratepayers, Cal Water is filing this advice letter to meet the deadline in Preliminary Statement Z3, rather than waiting until new rates are adopted in A.18-07-001.

Per-Service Refunds: The total sur-credit amount for each district translates into the flat, per-service surcredits, either on a one-time basis or for 12 months, in the table below:

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed.
