<u>Summary</u>

In recognition of the customer hardships posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, Cal Water has proposed to continue deferring the Selma groundwater Year 6 surcharge increase to January 1, 2021.¹ Currently, the existing groundwater surcharge is set to expire on July 31, 2020 and the year 6 surcharge to start August 1, 2021. However, Cal Water requests that the groundwater surcharges continue at existing rates from July 31, 2020 through January 1, 2021.

Background

Cal Water filed Advice Letter 2382 on April 15, 2020 to defer the annual April 15th Selma groundwater surcharge increase to August 1, 2020. Since then, customer hardships due to the COVID-19 pandemic are still present and Cal Water proposes to defer the rate increase to January 1, 2021.

In January 2014, Cal Water and the City of Selma ("the City") jointly filed an application to apply groundwater surcharges to customers in the Selma District (A.14-01-008). The requested surcharges are the result of a Cooperative Agreement between the City and the Consolidated Irrigation District ("CID") resolving litigation and establishing the funds that would be collected from Selma residents, and other towns in the Upper Kings River Basin, to replenish the overdrafted basin.

The Cooperative Agreement establishes two different fees payable to CID – "groundwater recharge (baseline) fees" at \$0.069 per CCF, and "groundwater replenishment fees" at \$0.23 per CCF – but allows the groundwater replenishment fees to be ramped up over an 8-year period, after which it will only be increased by the Consumer Price Index.

The Settlement Agreement approved by the Commission in D.15-03-003 allows groundwater surcharges to be applied to customer bills in the Selma District on a permanent basis to fund the full amount of the fee payable by the Ordinance adopted by the Selma Municipal Code. There is a groundwater surcharge for metered customers on a per-CCF basis, and there will be flat monthly groundwater surcharge for flat-rate customers until they are metered. Remittance of what is collected is sent to the City of Selma within 30 days after the end of each month. The table below indicates the percentage of the total fee to be collected each year during the phase-in:

Here is the history of the ramp-up thus far:

- For Year 1 (2015), the surcharges were calculated to collect \$160,810 from Selma residents and Advice Letters 2165 & 2165-A were filed on April 15, 2015.
- For Year 2, the calculated surcharges was \$158,970, and Advice Letters 2214 & 2214-A were filed on April 6, 2016.
- For Year 3, the surcharges were calculated to collect \$189,529, and Advice Letter 2275 was filed on March 24, 2017.



- For Year 4, the surcharges were calculated to collect \$235,254, and Advice Letter 2302 was filed on April 4, 2018.
- For Year 5, the surcharges were calculated to collect \$274,887, and Advice Letter 2340 was filed on April 10, 2019.

As shown in the table above, the City is allowed to increase the recovery from 62.5% to 75% of the calculated Replenishment Fees (plus a Consumer Price Index adjustment) in Year 6. As discussed below, Cal Water proposes that this increase occur on January 1, 2020, rather than August 1, 2020.

Discussion

Under the Settlement Agreement approved in D.15-03-003, the groundwater surcharges collected for the City and CID are increased each year on April 15th over an 8-year phase-in period. The increase for Year 6 would have normally occurred on April 15, 2020 and was originally deferred to August 1, 2020.²

Due to the continuing financial challenges many Selma customers are facing as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, for which California declared a state of emergency on March 4, 2020, Cal Water now proposes here to defer the Year 6 surcharge from August 1, 2020 to January 1, 2021. Cal Water also proposes that that subsequent surcharge increases occur on January 1st of each year, starting with the Year 7 surcharge increase on January 1, 2022.

This proposed deferral is structured to accomplish two goals. First, it would provide greater stability to water bills for the rest of 2020, during which access to water is central to combating the spread of COVID-19. Second, it would schedule future groundwater surcharge increases for January 1st, at the same time other water rate changes are likely to occur. Cal Water's customers have expressed a clear preference for less frequent changes to the rates on their water bills. Cal Water therefore now tries to coordinate such changes, whether due to base rate or surcharge/surcredit adjustments, so that they occur together at more predictable times, when possible.

In consultation with the City and CID, Cal Water will seek modification of D.15-03-003 to allow the surcharge increases to occur on January 1st rather than April 15th of each year, starting with the Year 6 increase on January 1, 2021. In subsequent advice letters, Cal Water will request authority to implement the Year 7 increase in the groundwater surcharge on January 1, 2022, and to implement the Year 8 increase on January 1, 2023.

A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The advice letter

The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

Replies

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. - All bills are subject to the following tariff schedules: Schedule UF (CPUC reimbursement fee) and <u>applicable</u> surcharges and surcredits on Schedule RSF (Rate Support Fund), Schedule LIRA (Low-Income Ratepayer Assistance), and Schedule AS (Additional Surcharges and Surcredits).
- 4. Fire sprinkler rates: A single-family residence with a meter size that has a "fire sprinkler" rate_(listed above) is eligible for that rate if: (a) the customer is paying for service where a residential_fire sprinkler system is required/requested to be installed by local fire or building codes; (b) a smaller_meter would be large enough to provide adequate service in the absence of the additional demand_needed to supply water to the system; (c) the sprinkler system is served through the meter providing_residential water service; and (d) the customer requests the "fire sprinkler" rate. The Company may seek verification that the above criteria are met. This service will be considered a general metered service, and not a fire service, so the rules and conditions for general metered service shall apply.
