## **Summary**

Cal Water requests to renew the groundwater surcharge rates for Selma District customers effective January 1, 2021, consistent with D.15-03-003 and Advice Letters 2382 and 2388.

### Background

In January 2014, Cal Water and the City of Selma ("the City") jointly filed an application to apply groundwater surcharges to customers in the Selma District. The requested surcharges are the result of a Cooperative Agreement between the City and the Consolidated Irrigation District ("CID") resolving litigation and establishing the funds that would be collected from Selma residents, and other towns in the Upper Kings River Basin, to replenish the overdrafted basin.

The Cooperative Agreement establishes two different fees payable to CID – "groundwater recharge (baseline) fees" at \$0.069 per CCF, and "groundwater replenishment fees" at \$0.23 per CCF – but allows the groundwater replenishment fees to be ramped up over an 8-year period. For the sixth year of the agreement (with 2015 being the first year), the City is allowed to increase the recovery from 62.5% to 75% of the calculated Replenishment Fees.

The Settlement Agreement allows groundwater surcharges to be applied to customer bills in the Selma District on a permanent basis to fund the full amount of the fee payable by the Ordinance adopted by the Selma Municipal Code.

For Year 1, the surcharges were calculated to collect \$160,810 from Selma residents and Advice Letters 2165 & 2165-A were filed in April 15, 2015. Remittance was sent to the City of Selma on January 22, 2016.

For Year 2, the calculated surcharges was \$158,970 and Advice Letters 2214 & 2214-A were filed in April 6, 2016. Remittance were sent to the City of Selma within 30 days after the end of each month.

For Year 3, the surcharges are calculated to collect \$189,529 from Selma residents. Advice Letters 2275 were filed in March 24, 2017. Remittance were sent to the City of Selma within 30 days after the end of each month.

For Year 4, the surcharges are calculated to collect \$235,254 from Selma residents. Advice letter 2302 was filed on April 4, 2018. Remittance were sent to the City of Selma within 30 days after the end of each month.

For Year 5, the surcharges are calculated to collect \$274,887 from Selma residents. Advice letter 2340 was filed on April 10, 2019. Remittance were sent to the City of Selma within 30 days after the end of each month.

For Year 6, the surcharges are calculated to collect \$379,793 for Selma residents. The Year 6 surcharge was originally scheduled to be implemented April 2020, however Cal Water deferred the change in surcharge until January 1, 2021.

### Discussion

Cal Water filed Advice letter 2382 on April 15, 2020 to request deferral of the Year 6 increase to July 2020 as a means to provide stability to water bills during the start of COVID-19. The Advice Letter also proposed to change the start dates of the Year 7 and 8 surcharge from April of each year to January 1<sup>st</sup>. Cal Water subsequently filed Advice Letter 2388 to request deferral of the Year 6 surcharge to January 1, 2021 due to the continued financial challenges many Selma customers faced as a result of COVID-19.

Attachment A to D.15-03-003 provides a one-page spreadsheet with the formulas for calculating the volumetric surcharge for metered customers, and the fixed surcharge for flat-rate customers. The formula takes into account the previous year's actual production, which determines the total amount to be collected from all Selma residents, and the previous year's actual sales, which is used to calculate the surcharge rates for a 12-month period.



As the attached spreadsheet shows, the total amount of \$379,793 to be calculated for 12 months is the sum of \$108,512 for groundwater recharge fees, and \$271,281 for groundwater replenishment fees (75% of the full amount, for Year 6). The total amount was allocated between metered customers based on annualized 2020 actual sales. For metered customers, this results in a surcharge of \$0.2329 per CCF, an increase of \$0.0750 per CCF over the current rate.

Based on the decision in Cal Water's 2018 GRC, D.20-12-007, there are no projected flat rate customers adopted for 2021, so the total collection amount will be recovered through metered customers.

## **Requested Effective Date**

Pursuant to General Order 96-B, General Rule 7.3.1, which allows Tier 1 advice letters to be effective pending disposition, Cal Water requests that this advice letter become effective on January 1, 2021.

## **Response or Protest**

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or



(6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. Cities and counties requiring Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division within the 20-day protest period so a late-filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

<u>Replies</u>: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. ## SPECIAL CONDITIONS (continued)

- 3. All bills are subject to the following tariff schedules: Schedule UF (CPUC reimbursement fee) and applicable surcharges and surcredits on Schedule RSF (Rate Support Fund), Schedule LIRA (Low-Income Ratepayer Assistance), and Schedule AS (Additional Surcharges and Surcredits).
- 4. Fire sprinkler rates: A single-family residence with a meter size that has a "fire sprinkler" rate (listed above) is eligible for that rate if: (a) the customer is paying for service where a residential fire sprinkler system is required/requested to be installed by local fire or building codes; (b) a smaller\_meter would be large enough to provide adequate service in the absence of the additional demand\_needed to supply water to the system; (c) the sprinkler system is served through the meter providing residential water service; and (d) the customer requests the "fire sprinkler" rate. The Company may seek verification that the above criteria are met. This service will be considered a general metered service, and not a fire service, so the rules and conditions for general metered service shall apply.
- 5. Groundwater surcharge (Year Five: January 1, 2021 December 31, 2021): \$0.2329 (I)(C)per CCF

Under the Cooperative Agreement between the City of Selma and the Consolidated Irrigation District, the surcharge identified above will be applied to bills on a monthly basis. Authorized by Decision 15-03-003 and Advice Letter 2392, the collected amounts will be provided to the City of Selma for groundwater replenishment activities. The total annual groundwater fees due under the Cooperative Agreement will be increased over the first 8 years.
