California Water Service Company ("Cal Water") hereby respectfully requests revenue increases in the ratemaking areas below to reflect pass-through cost increases in purchased water and pump taxes:

For Hermosa Redondo and Antelope Valley (Los Angeles County Region), in this advice letter Cal Water is requesting approval of a specific set of rates. Those rates are included in the attached tariffs.

For the remaining districts, Cal Water will be filing requests for additional rate changes that coincide with the pass-through cost increases proposed in this advice letter. Those future advice letters will include tariffs that also reflect the increases requested here. To see how this advice letter would change rates on a stand-alone basis (in those areas for which tariffs are not included in this advice letter), please see the last column in the relevant attachment labelled "Rate Adjustment Layers."

Therefore, in this advice letter, Cal Water is only requesting authority to make changes to the following tariffs for (1) Hermosa Redondo District, and (2) the Antelope Valley area of the Los Angeles County Region:

Summary

This filing proposes the following revenue increases to reflect higher purchased water and pump tax costs.

Cal Water is requesting an effective date of **January 1, 2021** for these increases. However, due to the delay in resolving Cal Water's General Rate Case (A.18-07-001), Cal Water is requesting an implementation date (when customers will start seeing the rate changes on their bills) of **February 1, 2021** for this and other rate changes authorized in D.20-12-007. This will provide the Commission with additional processing time to review those rate changes before customer bills are changed.¹

¹ Since January 1, 2020, customers' bills have been charged "Interim Rates" due to the delay in the case. In this advice letter, Cal Water proposes that these Interim Rates continue for the month of January 2021. The difference between



Background

Cal Water requests rate changes in this advice letter layered on other rate changes that are in compliance with the following Ordering Paragraphs in recently adopted D.20-12-007 for 2018 GRC proceeding:

Ordering Paragraph 1 of D.20-12-007 adopts the Settlement Agreement in the 2018 GRC proceeding (attached as Exhibit A to the decision) and resolves contested issues.

The joint motion to adopt the Settlement Agreement of California Water Service Company and Public Advocates Office (attached hereto as Attachment 1) is granted. The Settlement Agreement is approved and adopted.

- (1) OP 5: within 60 days, file a Tier 1 advice letter to revise tariff schedules in compliance with D.20-12-007.

5. For Test Year 2020, within 60 days of the effective date of this decision, California Water Service Company shall file Tier 1 advice letters with revised tariff schedules in compliance with this decision for each of its districts and rate areas considered in this proceeding, consistent with the adopted rates for each rate area as illustrated in the attached Appendices A through X. This filing shall be subject to approval by the Commission's Water Division.

- (2) OP 33: authorized to incorporate into new rates any revenue requirement changes approved by the Commission after July 2, 2018.

33. California Water Service Company is authorized to incorporate into the calculation of new rates any revenue requirement changes approved by the Commission after the July 2, 2018 filing of its application, and to notify customers of such changes via a bill insert utilizing language like that specified in the Settlement Agreement approved herein.

Background

In this advice letter, Cal Water is requesting approval to implement new rates that are consistent with Ordering Paragraphs 5 and 33 of D.20-12-007, as well as new purchased water and pump tax increases.

The rates referenced in OP 5 that are contained in D.20-12-007 already reflect the impact of revenue increases approved between July 2, 2018 and when the Settlement Agreement approved in D.20-12-007 was filed. Those "subsequent offsets" are listed in Attachment 1 of the Settlement Agreement approved in the decision.

They do not yet include increases the Commission approved after the Settlement Agreement was filed (October 8, 2019), however. Therefore, the rate changes requested in this advice letter

the Interim Rates and the final rates authorized by the Commission would be captured in the 2018 GRC Interim Rate Memorandum Account, and trued up at a later date.

In the first customer bills with new rates, Cal Water will include the explanatory language required by Ordering Paragraph 33.

Discussion

The new offsets requested in this advice letter are described in detail below.

Dominguez:

Purchased water for the Dominguez-South Bay District is obtained from the West Basin Municipal Water District (West Basin). Effective January 1, 2021, West Basin will increase its potable water rates by \$36 and recycled water rates by \$69/AF in each source rate, in accordance with its source type. West Basin will also increase its Fixed Service Charge by \$732,408 from the last calculated water service charge cost. In addition, Water Replenishment District of Southern California also increased its pump tax rate from \$365 per acre feet to \$382 per acre feet, effective July 1, 2020.

East Los Angeles:

Purchased water for the East Los Angeles District is obtained from the Central Basin Municipal Water District (Central Basin). Effective January 1, 2021, Central Basin will increase its quantity

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rates for Tier 1 from \$1,268 to \$1,302 per acre-foot. In addition, the Water Replenishment District of Southern California increased its pump tax rate from \$365 per acre feet to \$382 per acre feet, effective July 1, 2020.

Hermosa Redondo:

Purchased water for Hermosa-Redondo is obtained from the West Basin Municipal Water District (West Basin). Effective January 1, 2021, West Basin will increase its quantity rates from \$1,405/AF to \$1,441/AF. West Basin will also increase its Fixed Service Charge by \$327,900 from the last calculated water service charge cost. In addition, the Water Replenishment District of Southern California increased its pump tax rate from \$365 per acre feet to \$382 per acre feet effective, July 1, 2020.

Livermore:

Purchased water for Livermore is obtained from Zone 7 of the Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (Zone 7). The Board for Zone 7 approved new treated water schedules for 2021-2022 through Resolution 20-37. Effective January 1, 2021, the fixed charge will increase by \$429,081 annually.

Los Altos:

Purchased water for the Los Altos District is obtained from the Santa Clara Valley Water District (SCVWD) and San Jose Water Company (SJWC). Pump taxes are also paid to SCVWD. Effective January 1, 2021, SCVWD will decrease its contract water deliveries for Cal Water by 910 AF in its 2021 allotment, and the potable water cost will increase by \$100 per AF for non-contract water. Additionally, effective January 1, 2020, SCVWD had previously increased its recycled water rates by \$627 an acre-foot.

Los Angeles County Region:

Purchased water for the Palos Verdes area (a sub-region of the Los Angeles County Region), is obtained from the West Basin Municipal Water District (West Basin). From January 1, 2021, West Basin will increase its potable water rates from \$1,405/AF to \$1,441/AF. West Basin will also increase its Fixed Service Charge by \$552,556 from the last calculated water service charge cost.

Antelope Valley – In D.20-12-007, the Commission authorized a tariff split so that Antelope Valley customers would not have to fund the Palos Verdes Peninsula Water Reliability Project (PVPWRP) filed in Advice Letter 2387. Accordingly, Antelope Valley and Palos Verdes customers will return to having different rates. This advice letter includes a tariff just for the Antelope Valley area that does not include the impact of the PVPWRP

Palos Verdes – Another advice letter for the Palos Verdes area that reflects both the purchased water increase requested in this advice letter, and the impact of the PVPWRP, will include a proposed tariff for the Palos Verdes area.

Westlake:



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Purchased water for the Westlake District is obtained from the Calleguas Municipal Water District (Calleguas). Effective January 1, 2020, Calleguas increased its quantity rates for Tier 1 from \$1,472 to \$1,507 per acre-foot.

Rate Design Adjustments.

In similar offsets requested in previous advice letters, Cal Water recalculated rates by applying 100% of the purchased water and pump tax increases to quantity rates only. In the Settlement Agreement adopted in D.20-12-007, the Parties agreed that revenue increases would be reflected in both quantity rates and service charges. This is intended to maintain each ratemaking area's allocation between quantity rate revenue and service charge revenue at the agreed-upon percentage.²

RESOLUTION: After exchanging additional information and for the purpose of Settlement, the Parties agreed to the following:

- (a) Use the service charge and quantity revenue allocation ratios listed below;*
- (b) Use the adopted 2020 revenue allocation ratios for base rate adjustment filings in 2020 to 2022 from this GRC; and*
- (c) Eliminate the restriction of limiting service charge percentage increases to no greater than two times the ratemaking area's overall revenue percentage increase.³*

The rates calculated in this advice letter therefore apply the requested revenue increases between the quantity rates and the services charges to maintain the correct proportions.

Typical Bill Impacts

The table below shows the monthly bill impact of these increases for the typical residential customer (based on average 2019 usage).⁴ The typical bill increases are based on incremental changes in rates calculated for purchased water offset revenue increases only.

Requested Effective Date

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.)

The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. Language to be added to tariffs to reflect Purchased Water Offsets requested in AL 2394

Water Expense Increase: Beginning on February 1, 2021, rates in this area will reflect a 2.5% revenue increase (as compared to the revenue approved in Advice Letter 2373) due to higher charges imposed by the West Basin Municipal Water District and the Water Replenishment District of Southern California. This caused quantity rates to go up by the following amounts: \$0.0810/CCF for Tier 1 usage, \$0.1013/CCF for Tier 2 usage, and \$0.1521/CCF for Tier 3 usage. Amounts collected from these quantity rate increases will be tracked in a balancing account, as required by Section 792.5 of the Public Utilities Code, and will be trued up at a later time. Monthly service charges also went up, with the charge for a 5/8 x 3/4-inch meter increasing by \$0.61.

3. All bills are subject to the following tariff schedules: **Schedule UF** (CPUC reimbursement fee) and applicable surcharges and surcredits on **Schedule RSF** (Rate Support Fund), **Schedule LIRA** (Low-Income Ratepayer Assistance), and **Schedule AS** (Additional Surcharges and Surcredits).

* Reclaimed water customers that have signed a contract with the West Basin Municipal Water District (West Basin) for repayment of the conversion costs from potable to reclaimed water service will be charged the potable quantity rates while the contract is in effect. The Company will pay West Basin a percentage of the quantity rate revenues collected from reclaimed water customers billed at potable water rates. The percentage refunded represents the difference between the current West Basin wholesale potable water rate and the wholesale reclaimed water rate.

4. **Water Expense Increase:** Beginning on February 1, 2021, rates in this area will reflect a 2.4% revenue increase (as compared to the revenue approved in Advice Letter 2373) due to higher charges imposed by the West Basin Municipal Water District and the Water Replenishment District of Southern California. This caused quantity rates to go up by \$0.1028/CCF. Amounts collected from these quantity rate increases will be tracked in a balancing account, as required by Section 792.5 of the Public Utilities Code, and will be trued up at a later time. Monthly service charges also went up, with the charge for a 5/8 x 3/4-inch meter increasing by \$0.32.
