Advice Letter No. 2395

To The Public Utilities Commission of the State of California:

California Water Service Company (Cal Water) hereby transmits for filing the changes in its tariff schedules shown on **Attachment 2** for all districts listed below.

Summary

This advice letter requests approval of increases that were approved in Decision (D.) 20-12-007 for Escalation Year 2021 in the following areas: Bay Area Region, Bakersfield, Bear Gulch, Dominguez, East Los Angeles, Livermore, Los Altos, Marysville, Oroville, Salinas Valley Region (formerly Monterey Region), Visalia, Westlake, and Willows. This advice letter is timely due to the extension of time granted by Executive Director Rachel Peterson on December 14, 2020 (see Attachment 1).¹

In addition, recent consumption patterns in some areas have triggered the Sales Adjustment Mechanism (SRM). The water sales assumptions that underpin rates have therefore been adjusted in accordance with the SRM requirements in the following areas: **Bakersfield**, **Dominguez**, **East Los Angeles**, **Kern River Valley**, **Selma**, **Stockton**, and **Westlake**.

Cal Water is requesting an effective date of **January 1, 2021** for these increases. However, due to the delay in resolving Cal Water's General Rate Case (A.18-07-001), Cal Water is requesting an implementation date (when customers will start seeing the rate changes on their bills) of **February 1, 2021** for this and other rate changes authorized in D.20-12-007. This will provide the Commission with additional processing time to review those rate changes before customer bills are changed.²

Background

The Commission adopted the following Ordering Paragraphs in D.20-12-007:

1. The joint motion to adopt the Settlement Agreement of California Water Service Company and Public Advocates Office (attached hereto as Attachment 1) is granted. The Settlement Agreement is approved and adopted.

¹ On December 14, 2020, Executive Director Rachel Peterson granted Cal Water's request to file Tier 1 advice letters for escalation year 2021 rates by December 31, 2020 rather than 45 days before the effective date (the deadline for escalation filings established in D.07-05-062, page A-19), which would have been November 15, 2020.

² Since January 1, 2020, customers bills have been charged "Interim Rates" due to the delay in the case. In this advice letter, Cal Water proposes that these Interim Rates continue for the month of January 2021. The difference between the Interim Rates and the final rates authorized by the Commission would be captured in the 2018 GRC Interim Rate Memorandum Account, and trued up at a later date.

- 5. For Test Year 2020, within 60 days of the effective date of this decision, California Water Service Company shall file Tier 1 advice letters with revised tariff schedules in compliance with this decision for each of its districts and rate areas considered in this proceeding, consistent with the adopted rates for each rate area as illustrated in the attached Appendices A through X. This filing shall be subject to approval by the Commission's Water Division.
- 6. For escalation years 2021 and 2022, California Water Service Company shall file Tier 1 advice letters, in conformance with General Order 96-B and the Revised Water Rate Case Plan (Decision 07-05-062), proposing new revenue requirements and corresponding revised tariff schedules in each rate district and rate area in this proceeding, consistent with the adopted estimated rates for each rate area as illustrated in the attached Appendices A through X. This filing shall be subject to approval by the Commission's Water Division.
- 7. The advice letters shall follow the escalation procedures set forth in the Revised Rate Case Plan for Class A Water Utilities adopted in Decision 07-05-062 and shall include supporting workpapers. California Water Service Company shall file for rate reduction due to negative rate base growth, inflation factors, or customer growth. The revised tariff schedules shall take effect on January 1, 2021 and January 1, 2022, respectively, and apply to services rendered on and after their effective dates. The proposed revised revenue requirements and rates shall be reviewed by the Commission's Water Division. The Water Division shall inform the Commission if it finds that the revised rates do not conform to the Revised Rate case Plan, this decision, or other Commission decisions, and if so, reject the filing.
- 33. California Water Service Company is authorized to incorporate into the calculation of new rates any revenue requirement changes approved by the Commission after the July 2, 2018 filing of its application, and to notify customers of such changes via a bill insert utilizing language like that specified in the Settlement Agreement approved herein.

In addition, D. 20-12-007 continued the Sales Adjustment Mechanism (SRM) that provides for a rate adjustment in Years 2 and 3 if the actual sales volume for a ratemaking area is lower or higher than five percent of the adopted value for that ratemaking area.

Discussion

In this advice letter, Cal Water is requesting approval to implement new rates that are consistent with the above Ordering Paragraphs of D.20-12-007. In addition, D.20-12-007 continued the Sales Adjustment Mechanism (SRM) that provides for a rate adjustment in Years 2 and 3 if the actual sales volume for a ratemaking area is lower or higher than five percent of

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the adopted value for that ratemaking area. Finally, Cal Water proposes to add a special condition to the Kern River Valley District tariff that was inadvertently omitted.

In the first customer bills with new rates, Cal Water will include the explanatory language required by Ordering Paragraph 33.

Escalation Year 2021 Rates

The ratemaking areas in the table below have pro-forma rates of return for the twelve-month period through September 30, 2020 that make them eligible to receive an escalation increase in full or in part.

Cal Water has calculated the increased revenue requirements using inflation factors provided by the Public Advocates Office's (Cal PA's) energy cost of service branch and other provisions of D.20-12-007 in the table below. Any over- or under- collection from adopted revenue requirements related to commercial quantity rates will be tracked in the WRAM balancing account and are subject to the provisions of D.08-02-036.

Commission staff has been furnished copies of the detailed work papers showing the rates of return on rate base for the current twelve-month period based upon recorded data. Pro-forma rates of return for the twelve-month period through September 30, 2020 are shown below.

In order to properly implement the WRAM/MCBA mechanism first adopted in D.08-02-036 and continued in all subsequent GRCs, Cal Water proposes a modified Preliminary Statement M for each ratemaking area based on Rate Case Plan guidelines and reflecting the quantities and rate design proposed in this filing.

Sales Reconciliation Mechanism (SRM) Adjustments

When actual sales vary from adopted sales by more than 5%, the SRM is triggered, and rates are recalculated that reflect two changes. The SRM was triggered in the following ratemaking areas: Bakersfield, Dominguez, East Los Angeles, Kern River Valley, Selma, Stockton, and Westlake.

To recalculate rates for 2021 in accordance with the SRM, sales are first adjusted to reflect one-half of the total variation from adopted sales. Second, for the purposes of the SRM adjustment, an alternate revenue requirement is calculated that incorporates the change in production costs caused by having a change in sales.

The alternate revenue requirement is used solely to calculate the rates in this advice letter. The revenue requirement generated from the <u>escalation filing</u>, which is calculated in accordance with the rate case plan, is the revenue that Cal Water is proposing that the Commission adopt. Cal Water is <u>not</u> requesting to adopt the alternate revenue requirement as the new revenue requirement level, or to adopt the modified production costs as new values for purposes of the Preliminary Statement M.

Rate Design Adjustments

Generally, when Cal Water files an advice letter to request a change in revenue without a change in the number of customers or consumption, Cal Water has layered the incremental change on top of existing rates. For example, if the revenue change is 2%, existing rates can be changed by 2%. In this advice letter, however, when consumption levels are changing due to the SRM, the layering method would not generate accurate rates. Cal Water is requesting to modify the rate design to recalculate rates by taking the entire revenue requirement and redistributing it based on modified consumption and customer number. While Cal Water is requesting to modify the rate design, which would change the proposed rates, Cal Water is not requesting a change to the Preliminary Statement M.

Kern River Valley – Special Conditions for SDWBA New Connection Fees

Cal Water has determined that special conditions originally included in the tariffs for the Squirrel Mountain and Kernville areas when they were owned by the Kern River Valley Water Companies (fully held by the Dominguez Water Company) have been erroneously omitted from Cal Water's current Kern River Valley tariff. See **Attachment 2** for the original tariffs. The special conditions established "catch-up" fees to fund outstanding Safe Drinking Water Bond Act loans when new service to a previously-undeveloped premise is requested. In this advice letter, Cal Water proposes to remedy this oversight. This kind of special condition is already applicable to certain



areas in Cal Water's Bay Area Region. In an attempt to provide the greatest clarity the additional special condition proposed for the Kern River Valley tariff in this advice letter combines language from both the original tariff and the Bay Area Region tariff.

Requested Effective Date

Under General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1, as modified by Resolution W-4664 this is a Tier 1 advice letter with a requested **effective date of January 1, 2021** with **an implementation date of February 1, 2021**. The effectiveness is subject to refund pending the Commission staff's determination that the filing complies with the standard practice and the proposed rate design is equitable and correctly calculated.

Notice

Customer Notice – Notices of the surcharges and credits in this advice letter will be provided as a bill message on the first bill to impacted customers.

Service List – In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rule 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be transmitted *electronically* on December 18, 2020, to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification, including the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO). *Please note that, due to limitations on non-essential travel as a result of the COVID-19 virus, this advice letter will only be distributed electronically.* If applicable, paper copies will be distributed when administrative staff are able to return to company offices

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)



Advice Letter 2395, 2021 Escalation Increases and SRM Adjustments

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A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period. Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

Replies

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at 408/367-8200.

Dear Ms. Wales:

On October 30, 2020, California Water Service Company (Cal Water) submitted a request seeking extensions of time to comply with certain filing requirements, which were later affected by Ordering Paragraphs (OPs) 6 through and including 9 of Decision (D.) 20-12-007. Those Ordering Paragraphs relate, respectively, to the deadlines to file advice letters for the escalation rates for 2021, the Low-Income Ratepayer Assistance Surcharge and the Rate Support Fund.

We recognize that D.20-12-007 was just issued on December 3, 2020, and OPs 6 and 7 of that decision require Cal Water to submit Tier 1 advice letters for escalation year 2021 rates "no less than 45 days prior to the first day of the escalation year" which is now not possible, considering January 1, 2021 is less than 45 days away. In the same decision, OP 8 requires Cal Water to file a Tier 1 advice letter adjusting the Low-Income Ratepayer Assistance Surcharge "within 45 days of the effective date of this decision," whereas your company would ordinarily have filed such a letter on October 31, 2020 which has passed. Finally, we recognize that OP 9, concerning the Rate Support Fund, incorporates the partial Settlement Agreement which itself modifies elements of the Rate Support Fund program that affect calculation of the surcharge, and thereby nullifies Cal Water's October 31, 2020 calculation of the surcharge. That, in turn, now requires Cal Water to request an extension to December 31, 2020 to recalculate the surcharge.

Good cause being shown, Cal Water's requested extensions of time to comply with certain filing requirements are granted, and Cal Water is authorized with extensions to comply with OPs 6 through and including 9 of D.20-12-007, as follows:

- 1. The deadline for filing Tier 1 advice letters for escalation year 2021 rates is extended from November 15, 2020 to December 31, 2020,

The opening bill for metered service, except from conversion from flat rate service, shall be the established annual service charge for the service. Applicants who have had their approval revoked in this manner will be placed at the end of the waiting list.

12. Exemption for Saint Anthony's Monastery in RWV-Coast Springs

Two residential water connections are reserved for the property formerly owned by Cynthia Christopher and Geronima Belen and subsequently sold to the Saint Anthony's Monastery. Those two reserved connections are exempt from the requirement to provide a building permit within 18 months or be dropped from the approved service connections list.
