Advice Letter No. 2419

To the California Public Utilities Commission:

California Water Service Company (Cal Water) respectfully requests approval to implement the new tariffs changes listed in **Attachment 1**. Please note that, due to limitations on non-essential travel as a result of the COVID-19 virus, this advice letter will only be distributed electronically to the Water Division and the attached service lists.

#### **Summary**

Cal Water requests approval of the potable water tariffs for the new "Millerton District" consistent with the Commission authorization granted in Decision (D.) 21-08-007. Cal Water files this as a Tier 1 advice letter with a requested effective date of March 15, 2022, the date customers are currently anticipated to join the newly established system.

#### **Background**

The Preserve at Millerton is a master-planned, mixed-use community in Madera County currently under development that will include residences, commercial/office space, parks, community facilities, and associated infrastructure. It is located north of Friant, California, and west of Millerton Lake. Cal Water's regulated Selma District is approximately 40 miles south of the area.

Cal Water and NFC-1 Investments L.L.C. (Developer) have entered into an Asset and Real Property Purchase and Sale Agreement (P&S Agreement) where Cal Water will purchase the water and wastewater systems from the Developer subject to certain terms and conditions. Cal Water filed Application (A.) 20-01-012 on January 24, 2020 requesting a certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) to provide water and wastewater service to the new customers at this development.

As proposed in the Application, the developer would complete construction of the proposed water and wastewater systems necessary to serve The Preserve at Millerton. Following the acquisition, Cal Water will operate the water and wastewater systems as a public utility subject to the Commission's regulatory authority. The newly formed "Millerton District" would be an independent ratemaking area, with operational assistance initially provided by employees from Cal Water's Selma District.

On August 5, 2021, the Commission approved Cal Water's CPCN application in D.21-08-007 and adopted the initial rates, tariffs, and tariff rules for customers in the following Ordering Paragraphs:

- 2. A Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct a Public Utility Water System Near Friant, CA in Madera County and to Establish Rates For Service is granted to California Water Service Company.
- 4. California Water Service Company shall establish, for operational and ratemaking purposes, a new Millerton District, to encompass all customers at The Preserve at Millerton.
- 5. The initial rates, tariffs, and tariff rules for customers at The Preserve at Millerton proposed in California Water Service Company's Application are approved.
- 6. California Water Service Company shall submit a Tier One Advice Letter to the Commission's Water Division documenting the tariff schedules, tariff rules, and service area maps for water and wastewater service approved by this decision within 45 days of the effective date of this decision.

#### **Discussion**

In this advice letter, Cal Water is requesting approval to implement the potable water tariff, service area map for the new, Commission-regulated "Millerton District" consistent with Ordering Paragraph 6 above.

While Cal Water is in compliance with the decision's requirement to file within 45 days, note that the new mixed-use development is still under construction and that Cal Water cannot start serving customers at this time. Currently, the developer is estimating that some of the facilities could be in first use by customers around the mid-March 2022 timeframe. However, given the relative uncertainty that can affect new developments (e.g., economic conditions, construction constraints, pandemic delays, etc.), <u>please note</u> that this timeframe is subject to, and likely will, change.

Cal Water currently plans to take responsibility for the water and wastewater systems after construction is complete, but before the first customers move in. If the construction/move-in dates slip significantly past March 15, 2022, Cal Water may file a supplement to this advice letter requesting a later effective date. This would allow Cal Water to schedule the posting of the Millerton District tariffs online according to when the water and wastewater services actually become available.

#### **Requested Effective Date**

Cal Water is submitting this as a **Tier 1** advice letter pursuant to D.21-08-007 and General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1(3). Cal Water requests the tariffs be considered effective, **March 15, 2022** subject to the condition set forth in the discussion above.



#### **Notice**

Customer Notice – Individual customer notice of this advice letter is not required under General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 3.2 (Special Notice Rules for Compliance Advice Letter, Certain Tier 1 Advice Letters) and there are no customers currently receiving service.

Service Lists – In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rule 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be transmitted electronically on **September 20, 2021** to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification, including the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO). Please note that, due to limitations on non-essential travel as a result of the COVID-19 virus, this advice letter will only be distributed electronically.

#### **Response or Protest**

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties requiring Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division within the 20-day protest period so a late-filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

<u>Replies</u>: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at (408) 367-8200, and ask for the Rates Department.


