Advice Letter No. 2437

To the California Public Utilities Commission:

California Water Service Company ("Cal Water") respectfully submits this Tier 1 advice letter requesting authority to make the following changes to tariffs applicable to multiple ratemaking areas listed in **Attachment A**.

Summary

This Tier 1 advice letter requests approval of tariffs that reflect the net impact of Advice Letters 2433 through 2435 for the following tariff areas: Bear Gulch (BG), Dominguez ("DOM"), East Los Angeles, Hermosa-Redondo ("HR"), Livermore ("LIV"), Oroville ("ORO"), Westlake ("WLK"), the Antelope area of Los Angeles County Region ("LAR"), and the Palos Verdes area of LAR. This advice letter does not request any additional revenue or rate changes. The requested effective date is January 1, 2022.

Background

On November 15, 2021, Cal Water filed an Advice Letter 2433 (Tier 1) for approval of step increases and rate adjustments due to the Sales Reconciliation Mechanism ("SRM") with a requested effective date of January 1, 2022.

On November 17, 2021, Cal Water filed a Advice Letter 2434 (Tier 2) for a rate base offset in the Oroville District relating to a Station 1 and Station 3 merge and rebuild project, with a requested effective date of January 1, 2022.

On December 3, 2021, Cal Water filed Advice Letter 2435 (Tier 1) on December 3, 2021 for purchased water/pump tax offsets in the Bear Gulch, Dominguez, East Los Angeles, Hermosa-Redondo, Livermore, Los Angeles County Region, and Westlake areas with a requested effective date of January 1, 2022.

Discussion

This Tier 1 filing provides new rates for eight of Cal Water's Class A ratemaking areas to reflect the net impact of the requests in the following advice letters that are currently under review by the Water Division:

- 1) AL 2433 for 2022 Step Rates and SRM rate adjustments (filed 11/15/21; pending)
- 2) AL 2434 for an Oroville rate base offset (filed 11/17/21; pending)



3) AL 2435 for purchased water/pump tax offsets in the Bear Gulch, Dominguez, East Los Angeles, Hermosa-Redondo, Livermore, Los Angeles County Region, and Westlake ratemaking areas (filed 12/3/21; pending)

The workpapers supporting the proposed tariffs layer the rate base offset and purchased water/pump tax offsets on top of the 2022 Step Rates and SRM rate adjustments.

<u>Cosmetic Tariff Changes</u>. Cal Water also requests approval for the following non-substantive changes to the attached tariffs:

- Adding the term "approximately" in front of the reference to 1 CCF equaling 748 gallons on the first page of each tariff.
- Changing "reclaimed" to "recycled:" Cal Water previously updated some tariffs to replace "reclaimed" with "recycled," a term that is more accessible to the general public. These terms have historically been used synonymously in Cal Water's tariffs and rules. This language update is continued in the attached tariffs where relevant.
- Changing "LIRA" to "CAP:" As required by D.20-08-047, Cal Water has changed the name of the Low-Income Ratepayer Assistance Program (LIRA) to the Customer Assistance Program (CAP). No substantive changes were made to the program. The references to "LIRA" are being replaced with "CAP" on tariffs as modifications to those tariffs are being requested for other reasons.

Requested Effective Date

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation because it does not request substantive changes, and instead combines other rate changes currently under consideration by the Water Division. Cal Water requests that the rates become effective on **January 1, 2022**.

<u>Customer Notice</u>: The tariff changes requested in this Tier 1 advice letter do not require notice pursuant to General Order 96-B, General Rule 4.2 and Water Industry Rule 7.3.1.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:



- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties requiring Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division within the 20-day protest period so a late-filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

<u>Replies</u>: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at (408) 367-8200, and ask for the Rates Department.

- 2. All bills are subject to the following tariff schedules: **Schedule UF** (CPUC reimbursement fee) and applicable surcharges and surcredits on Schedule RSF (Rate Support Fund), Schedule CAP (Customer Assistance Program), and Schedule AS (Additional Surcharges and Surcredits).
- 3. Fire sprinkler rates: A single-family residence with a meter size that has a "fire sprinkler" rate (listed above) is eligible for that rate if: (a) the customer is paying for service where a residential fire sprinkler system is required/requested to be installed by local fire or building codes; (b) a smaller meter would be large enough to provide adequate service in the absence of the additional demand needed to supply water to the system; (c) the sprinkler system is served through the meter providing residential water service; and (d) the customer requests the "fire sprinkler" rate. The Company may seek verification that the above criteria are met. This service will be considered a general metered service, and not a fire service, so the rules and conditions for general metered service shall apply.
- 4. Water Expense Increase: Beginning on January 1, 2022 rates in this area will reflect a 0.2% revenue increase (as compared to the revenue approved in Advice Letter 2395) due to higher surcharges imposed by the Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency and collected by San Francisco Public Utilities Commission. This caused quantity rates to go up by the following amounts: \$0.0111/CCF for Tier 1 usage, \$0.0139/CCF for Tier 2 usage, and \$0.0207/ CCF for Tier 3 usage. Amounts collected from these quantity rate increases will be tracked in a balancing account, as required by Section 792.5 of the Public Utilities Code, and will be trued up at a later time. Monthly service charges also went up, with the charge for a 5/8 x \%-inch meter increasing by \\$0.05.
