To the California Public Utilities Commission:

California Water Service Company ("Cal Water") respectfully submits this Tier 2 advice letter requesting authority to add and make the following changes to tariffs applicable to all ratemaking areas including Grand Oaks.

Purpose

The purpose of this advice letter is to establish a Drinking Water Fee Memorandum Account to track the difference between drinking water fees charged by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) under its new rates and the drinking water fees authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission).

Background

On September 22, 2021, the State Water Board adopted emergency regulations that adjusted drinking water fees to conform to the revenue levels set forth in the Budget Act for fiscal year (FY) 2021-22. The proposed emergency regulation will adjust the fee schedule adopted in FY 2019-20 to increase fees approximately 26.6 percent on average for community water systems, including Cal Water.

Discussion

The State Water Board's new drinking water fees results in a dramatic increase in expenses to Cal Water for the same level of service. The new, higher expenses are not included in presently-authorized rates. The requested memorandum account will track the difference between drinking water fees charged by the State Water Board under its new billing methodology, and the drinking water fees authorized by the Commission, until such fees are reflected in authorized rates through a general rate case.



Requirements for new Memorandum Accounts

In order to qualify for a new memorandum account, the four requirements of Standard Practice U-27-W must be met. As discussed below, this request complies with those requirements.

1. The expense is caused by an event of an exceptional nature that is not under the utility's control.

The action by the State Water Board was taken in an emergency rulemaking. The State Water Board, of course, is not under Cal Water's control, making the new, higher expenses both exceptional in nature and not under Cal Water's control.

2. The expense cannot have been reasonably foreseen in the utility's last general rate case and will occur before the utility's next general rate case.

Because the action by the State Water Board was taken in an emergency rulemaking on September 22, 2021 the expenses are not in Cal Water's current rates (adopted in A.18-07-001 by D.20-12-007), and could not have been reasonably foreseen in Cal Water's pending GRC (A.21-07-002). Furthermore, the fees will be incurred before the next scheduled general rate case in 2024.

3. The expense is of a substantial nature as to the amount of money involved when any offsetting cost decreases are taken into account.

The State Water Board estimates that its action will increase drinking water fees by approximately 26.6 percent, which is a substantial increase over both the currently authorized expenses in D.20-12-007, and the drinking water fees projected in A.21-07-002 that are based on historical trends, rather than on the substantial increase that will result from the recent State Water Board action.

4. The ratepayers will benefit by the memorandum account treatment.

The payment of drinking water fees provides funding to the State Water Board for issuing permit amendments, reviewing compliance data, and conducting sanitary inspections, all of which are activities directly benefitting ratepayers by ensuring a safe drinking water supply.

Requested Effective Date

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 2 designation pursuant to Water Industry Rules 7.3.2(5) of General Order 96-B.

On September 22, 2021, the SWRCB adopted emergency regulations that adjusted drinking water fees. Cal Water requests that the new Drinking Water Fee Memorandum Account become effective on the date of filing **December 16, 2021** due to the emergency regulations.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

Replies:

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not receive a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at 408-367-8200 and ask for the Rates Department.

1. Purpose

The purpose of the Drinking Water Fees Memorandum Account (DWFMA) is to track the difference between all actual fees charged by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) (based upon the revised fee schedule adopted by the State Board on September 22, 2021) and the State Board fees authorized in rates.

2. Applicability

The DWFMA will track the difference between the State Board fees and the State Board fees authorized in rates, and is applicable to all regulated ratemaking areas. Pursuant to Standard Practice U-27-W ("SP U-27") of the Water Division, the DWFMA will earn interest at the 90-day commercial paper rate.

3. Disposition

Prior to recovery, charges made to the DWFMA are subject to a reasonableness review.

4. Effective Date

The DWFMA will be made effective on the effective date of AL 2438. The DWFMA will sunset with the effective date of the utility's Test Year rates from its 2024 General Rate Case application.
