To The Public Utilities Commission of the State of California:

California Water Service Company (“Cal Water”) respectfully submits this Tier 1 advice letter requesting authority to make the following changes to tariffs applicable to the following Class A ratemaking areas: Bay Area Region (BAY/RDV), Bear Gulch, Dixon, Dominguez, East L.A., Hermosa-Redondo, Kern River Valley, LA County Region (PV/AV), Livermore, Los Altos, Marysville, Oroville, Salinas Valley Region (KC/SLN), Selma, Stockton, Visalia, and Willows.¹

Summary

This advice letter is filed pursuant to the terms and conditions outlined in Preliminary Statement Z4 for the “Conservation Expense One-Way Balancing Account 4” (CEBA4) approved in D.20-12-007. Cal Water hereby requests authority to return unused conservation expenses to customers in the ratemaking areas identified above through fixed one-time or 12-month surcredits starting May 5, 2023.

Discussion

In D.20-12-007 and the Settlement Agreement (Exhibit A to D.20-12-007) adopted therein, the Commission adopted a three-year conservation expense budget totaling \$24,599,958 for Cal Water’s 21 ratemaking areas (to be expended over the rate case period of 2020-2022). The funds are not transferable between districts but may be carried forward to subsequent years within each district. A breakdown of the approved budget by year and operating district² are provided in the table that follows.

¹ This advice letter impacts all Class A ratemaking areas except Bakersfield, Chico, Travis, and Westlake.

² While some of Cal Water’s Class A “operating districts” have been consolidated for ratemaking purposes into “regions,” conservation expenses specific to each operating district were approved in D.20-12-007.

Unspent Funds: Cal Water was authorized to track the difference between the conservation expenses approved in rates for 2020-2022, and the conservation expenses actually incurred, by category, in the Conservation Expense One-Way Balancing Account 4 (CEBA4). Section 4.b of the associated Preliminary Statement Z4 requires Cal Water to file an advice letter by March 31, 2023 to refund the balances, and specifies the methods for the refunds, either through a one-time surcredit or a 12-month surcredit.

Section 4 of Preliminary Statement Z4 states:

- b. If the total amount recorded in section 3.h. for any district as of December 31, 2022 is a positive number (meaning accumulated expenditures are less than the three-year authorization), Cal Water shall file an advice letter by March 31, 2023 to refund this amount to ratepayers. This refund should be made as a one-time conservation credit unless the average credit per customer exceeds 50% of the adopted monthly service charge for a residential 5/8 X 3/4-inch meter, in which case the credit should be made over a 12-month period.

At this time, in the absence of a final decision in A.21-07-002 (2021 GRC), Cal Water is complying with Section 4(b) of Preliminary Statement Z4, which requires Cal Water to file an advice letter for conservation refunds by “March 31, 2023.”

No other expenses can be booked to the CEBA for activities after December 31, 2022, so the end balances for each district are known, and will not change except to reflect additional interest. In an abundance of caution, and because these are known amounts owed to ratepayers, Cal Water is filing this advice letter to meet the deadline in Preliminary Statement Z4, rather than waiting until a decision is adopted in A.21-07-002.

Per-Service Refunds: As shown in the table above, the Bakersfield, Chico, and Westlake Districts will not be eligible for refunds. For all remaining districts except the Travis District, the total unspent amount (plus interest) for each district translates into a flat, per-service surcredit, either on a one-time basis or for 12 months as indicated below. (A refund for the Travis District will be addressed through a separate advice letter after Cal Water determines whether the Travis Air Force Base prefers a one-time credit or an amortized credit.)

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line. A response

supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties requiring Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division within the 20-day protest period so a late-filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

Replies: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you
