Summary

Cal Water requests authority to amortize the Pension Cost Balancing Account (PCBA4) and Healthcare Cost Balancing Account (HCBA4) that tracked the difference between adopted and actual costs for the period of 2020-2022. This is a filed as a Tier 2 advice letter with a requested effective date of July 31, 2023.

Background

PCBA4 and HCBA4 were authorized in Cal Water's 2018 General Rate Case (A.18-07-001) to track the difference between actual and adopted costs – pension-related costs and healthcare-related costs, respectively – for the period of 2020-2022.¹ Since the pension and healthcare cost balancing accounts have been approved (starting in the 2009 GRC for pension costs and starting in the 2012 GRC for healthcare costs), Cal Water has amortized the accounts using the same methodology after the close of the rate case period via Tier 2 advice letters. In the partial settlement between Cal Water and Cal Advocates in the pending 2021 GRC (A.21-07-002), the

parties agreed that review of the PCBA and HCBA authorized in the 2018 GRC would be through Tier 2 advice letter process.²

Authority to File. Cal Water's 2021 GRC application (for a 2023 Test Year) is still pending. Accordingly, there is no ordering paragraph directing Cal Water to amortize the PCBA4 and HCBA4 balances. However, as of December 31, 2022, the PCBA4 balance of \$17.4 million exceeds 2% of the authorized revenue requirement for 2022, which was \$15.4 million (2% of \$769.5 million). As such, pursuant to Standard Practice U-27-W,³ Cal Water requests amortization of the PCBA4. The HCBA balance of \$14 million approached the 2% threshold, but did not exceed it. However, as amortizing the HCBA results in a credit to customers, Cal Water does not want to delay the amortization request until a decision in the 2021 GRC is eventually issued.

Discussion

The PCBA4 and the HCBA4 are applicable to the 21 Class A ratemaking areas whose rates in 2020-2022 included forecasts for pension and healthcare costs. The period for tracking costs in the accounts ended on December 31, 2022. With the Commission's determination in D.20-12-007 that Cal Water's methodology for calculating the differences between recorded and adopted costs is appropriate as discussed above, Cal Water requests amortization of the accounts starting July 31, 2023.⁴

1) Preliminary Statement AA4: Pension Cost Balancing Account 4 (PCBA4)

As of December 31, 2022, the company-wide balance in the PCBA4 for the three-year period of 2020-2022 is a receivable of \$17,409,975. For cost recovery, Cal Water has allocated these costs to its 21 applicable Class A ratemaking areas based on adopted payroll expense. The consumption-based surcharge (per CCF) for each district is based on the usage in that district and will be applied for 12 months. For flat-rate residential Bakersfield customers, a usage amount is attributed to those customers and a fixed monthly surcharge is calculated based on the total number of flat customers.

2) Preliminary Statement AB4: Health Cost Balancing Account 4 (HCBA4)

As of December 31, 2022, the company-wide balance in the HCBA4 for the three-year period of 2020-2022 that is payable to customers via surcredit is \$14,042,588. This amount is 85% of the healthcare cost savings tracked in the account. (Under the terms

of the two-way balancing account, Cal Water may retain 15% of the savings tracked in the balancing account. If there had been excess health care costs, Cal Water would have been able to request recovery of only 85% of the excess health care costs.)

Cal Water has allocated these savings to its 21 applicable Class A ratemaking areas based on adopted payroll expense. The credit calculated for each district depends upon the number of customers in that district and will be returned to customers over 12 months.

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. 2. Pension Cost & Healthcare Cost Balancing Accounts

The purpose of the **Pension Cost Balancing Account (PCBA)** is to true up the difference between actual pension costs and those that were adopted by the CPUC for calendar years 2020-2022. Actual pension costs exceeded adopted costs for this period, so surcharges will be applied, with a per-CCF surcharge (per 100 Cubic ft.) for metered customers, and a fixed surcharge per service for flat-rate customers. Surcharges vary by ratemaking area and will be in effect for a period of 12 months (except for a lump-sum charge for Travis).

The purpose of the **Healthcare Cost Balancing Account (HCBA)** is to true up the difference between actual healthcare costs and those that were adopted by the CPUC for the calendar years 2020-2022. Adopted healthcare costs exceeded actual costs for this period, so a fixed sur-credit will be applied to each service connection. Sur-credits vary by ratemaking area and will be in effect for a period of 12 months (except for a lump-sum credit for Travis).
