## CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY (U-60-W)

To The Public Utilities Commission of the State of California:

California Water Service Company (Cal Water) requests revenue increases associated with passthrough cost increases for the Dominguez, East Los Angeles, Hermosa-Redondo, Livermore, Los Angeles County Region, and Westlake tariff areas. This advice letter will not include proposed tariffs, however, because Cal Water will be submitting another advice letter with tariffs that implements the higher rate of return (RoR) ordered in D.23-06-025, with the same effective date, January 1, 2024. Instead of proposed tariffs, **Attachment A** reflects sample rates that would result from the pass-through cost revenue increases alone, without the RoR increase.

# Please note that this advice letter will only be distributed electronically to the Water Division and the attached service lists.

## <u>Summary</u>

This filing proposes revenue increases to reflect the higher costs associated with purchased water and pump taxes in the ratemaking areas detailed below. Cal Water requests an effective date of January 1, 2024, for this Tier 1 advice letter.

## **Discussion**

The basis for the revenue increases in the table above is described for each ratemaking area below.



## Dominguez:

Purchased water for the Dominguez District is obtained from the West Basin Municipal Water District (West Basin). Effective January 1, 2024, West Basin will increase its Tier 1 potable water rates from \$1,605 per acre-foot to \$1,677 per acre-foot.

## East Los Angeles:

Purchased water for the East Los Angeles District is obtained from the Central Basin Municipal Water District (Central Basin). Effective January 1, 2024, Central Basin will increase its quantity rates for Tier 1 from \$1,379 to \$1,426 per acre-foot. In addition, the Water Replenishment District of Southern California increased its pump tax rate from \$411 per acre-foot to \$423 per acre-foot effective, July 1, 2023.

## Hermosa-Redondo:

Purchased water for the Hermosa-Redondo District is obtained from West Basin. Effective January 1, 2024, West Basin will increase its Tier 1 potable water rates from \$1,605 per acre-foot to \$1,677 per acre-foot.

## Livermore:

Purchased water for the Livermore District is obtained from Zone 7 of the Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (Zone 7). The Board for Zone 7 approved new treated water schedules for 2023-2026 through Resolution 22-93. Effective January 1, 2024, the potable water rates will increase from \$2.06 to \$2.34/CCF, but the fixed charge for the Livermore District will decrease by \$92,169 annually.

## Los Angeles County Region:

Purchased water for the Palos Verdes area (a sub-region of the Los Angeles County Region), is obtained from West Basin. Effective January 1, 2024, West Basin increased its Tier 1 potable water rates from \$1,605 per acre-foot to \$1,677 per acre-foot.

Note that, in D.20-12-007, the Commission authorized a tariff split so that Antelope Valley customers would not have to fund the most expensive main replacement line in Cal Water's history, the Palos Verdes Peninsula Water Reliability Project (PVPWRP) (with capital costs at over \$100 million), approved through Advice Letter 2387. Accordingly, Antelope Valley and Palos Verdes customers have returned to having different sets of rates. They are still consolidated for ratemaking purposes, however, so the purchased water offset requested here affects both Palos Verdes and Antelope Valley customers (albeit with different bill impacts).

## Westlake:

Purchased water for the Westlake District is obtained from the Calleguas Municipal Water District (Calleguas) and the Triunfo Water & Sanitation District (Triunfo). Effective January 1, 2024, Calleguas will increase its potable water quantity rates for Tier 1 from \$1,632 to \$1,730 per acre-foot. Because Triunfo recycled water rates are equal to 80% of the Calleguas potable water rates, water purchased from Triunfo will be \$1,384 per acre-foot.

## Allocation of Revenue Increase:

Current rates are calculated based on a Commission-approved allocation of revenue collected from consumption-based rates versus fixed monthly service charges. Because the costs of purchased water and groundwater replenishment include variable and fixed charges in nature, in the Settlement Agreement adopted in D.20-12-007, Cal Water and Cal Advocates agreed that all revenue increases between rate cases should be reflected in both the quantity rates and service charges of Cal Water customers so that the authorized revenue allocation percentages are maintained. The rates proposed in this advice letter maintain the appropriate allocations.

## Typical Residential Bill Impact:

The table below shows the monthly bill impact of these offsets for the typical residential customer (based on median 2022 usage). The typical bill increases are based on incremental changes in rates calculated for purchased water and pump tax offset revenue increases only.

## Sample Tariffs:

As noted above, Cal Water will be requesting an additional rate change with an effective date that coincides with the purchase water and pump tax offsets proposed in this advice letter. Cal Water will request to implement the higher rate of return established by the Commission in D.23-06-025 effective January 1, 2024. In that submission, Cal Water will provide proposed tariffs that reflect both the RoR increase and the purchase water and pump tax offsets described herein. For informational purposes, however, **Attachment A** shows what the rates proposed in this advice letter would be in the absence of the RoR change.

## **Requested Effective Date**

Under General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1, as modified by Resolution W-4664, this is a Tier 1 advice letter. Cal Water requests that the rates proposed in this advice letter become effective on **January 1, 2024**.

## **Response or Protest**

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests, or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

## Replies:

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at 408-367-8200 and ask for the Rates Department.
