Advice Letter No. 2513



To the California Public Utilities Commission:

California Water Service Company ("Cal Water") respectfully submits this Tier 1 advice letter in compliance with Ordering Paragraph 12 of D.19-07-015, *Decision Adopting an Emergency Disaster Relief Program for Electric, Natural Gas, Water and Sewer Utility Customers* with regards to the collaboration with state agencies due to the impact on Cal Water's customers during the March severe winter storms within our Kern River Valley and Salinas Valley Region ratemaking areas. *Please note that this advice letter will only be distributed electronically.*

Summary

This Tier 1 advice letter confirms Cal Water's compliance with the collaboration activities required by D.19-07-015 triggered by the severe winter storms in March 2023 that affected parts of Cal Water's Kern River Valley and Salinas Valley Region ratemaking areas.

Background

D.19-07-015 requires water and sewer companies to file a Tier 1 advice letter 12 months after a state of emergency was proclaimed for an event affecting the water or sewer company. The Tier 1 advice letter is intended to affirm to the California Public Utilities Commission that the company is complying with the collaboration activities.

In D.19-07-015, the Commission provided as follows in Ordering Paragraph 12:

12. All Class-A Water utilities ... shall file a Tier 1 Advice Letter twelve months from a qualifying event, documenting the collaborative engagement they had with the Governor's Office of Emergency Services and the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection demonstrating information sharing that aided these entities in carrying out their mission.

The Commission also adopted the following Conclusion of Law relevant to Ordering Paragraph 12:

21. It is reasonable to require the utilities, twelve months following a qualifying event, to file a Tier 1 Advice Letter describing the collaborative engagement they had with CalOES and CalFIRE demonstrating information sharing that aided CalOES and CalFIRE to carry out their missions.

Discussion

As described in Advice Letter 2476 (submitted on March 24, 2023), President Biden declared a state of emergency California on March 10, 2023¹ relating to the emergency conditions resulting from severe winter storms, flooding, landslides, and mudslides beginning on March 9, 2023. The declaration applied to 34 counties in California, including Monterey County and Kern County.

The severe storms started impacting parts of Cal Water's Kern River Valley district on March 10, 2023 and Salinas Valley Region on March 12, 2023, triggering the requirements of D.19-07-015. This advice letter addresses the collaborative activities Cal Water engaged in with state agencies as a result of the March storms.

Cal Water was involved in communications with the Governor's Office of Emergency Services for the Statewide Winter Storms that impacted Cal Water's Kern River Valley and Salinas Valley Region ratemaking areas. The Governor's Office of Emergency Services Business Operations Center was open and active from 7am to 7pm during the height of the storms. In email communications they provided updates during the storms mentioning Governor Gavin Newsom Emergency Proclamations and President Biden's approval of California's request for a Presidential Major Disaster Declaration to support response and recovery efforts.

Requested Effective Date

Pursuant to OP 12 of D.19-07-015, this is filed as a Tier 1 advice letter. Cal Water does not request a specific effective date since this is a compliance filing without changes to Cal Water's tariffs.

Notice

Customer Notice – Customer notice of Tier 1 advice letters is not required under General Order 96-B, General Rule 7.3.1.

Service Lists – In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rule 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be transmitted electronically on **March 14, 2024,** to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

(1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;

- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties requiring Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division within the 20-day protest period so a late-filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

<u>Replies</u>: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at (408) 367-8200, and ask for the Rates Department.
