Summary

This advice letter requests a decrease in the Franchise Tax rate on San Carlos customers from 1.733% to 1.111%.

Background

In AL 1363 (November 9, 1994), Cal Water requested the addition of a separate surcharge on its tariffs to separate out the franchise fees the company submits to the City of San Carlos. Since approval of AL 1363, the tariffs for the ratemaking areas¹ that include San Carlos have included the following language:

Surcharge for San Carlos Franchise Tax (for customers within the City of San Carlos) – 1.733%.

Discussion

Cal Water proposes to update the franchise fee to 1.111% from 1.733%, and also to modify the description to refer to it as a "fee" rather than a "tax" consistent with the language used by the City of San Carlos (City). As modified, the tariff language would be changed to:

¹ San Carlos and San Mateo were consolidated into the "Mid-Peninsula District," and later consolidated into the "Bayshore District." Effective January 1, 2017, Bayshore District and the Redwood Valley District have been consolidated into the "Bay Area Region."

Surcharge for San Carlos Franchise Fee (for customers within the City of San Carlos) – 1.111%.

<u>Calculation of the franchise amount given to the City</u>: The franchise amount Cal Water must remit to the City each year is described as 2% of "gross annual receipts arising from the use, operation, or possession of said franchise." See Section 5 of San Carlos Ordinance 648 (provided as **Attachment A**). This 2% cannot be directly applied to the bills of San Carlos customers for several reasons, including:

- The franchise fee methodology requires identification of the amount of mains and services physically located in the City.
- The "gross annual receipts" refers actual revenues actually collected from San Carlos customers, while the water bills paid by San Carlos customers are based on rates calculated using the revenue requirement of the entire Bay Area Region.

<u>Calculation of the "franchise fee" listed on Cal Water's tariffs</u>: Cal Water estimates that, for calendar year 2025, the franchise amount that will be owed to the City will be approximately \$220,000. Since there is no adopted revenue requirement for the City of San Carlos, Cal Water made assumptions to develop a pro-rated "revenue requirement" for San Carlos customers based on current Bay Area Region revenues and rates. As reflected in workpapers, a surcharge of **1.111%** will collect the estimated franchise amount of \$220,000 based on the above assumptions.

<u>Change in Surcharge Name</u>: Cal Water also proposes to change the surcharge name from a "tax" to a "fee" to avoid any confusion with the state franchise tax to which all businesses are subject.

Requested Effective Date

Cal Water is submitting this as a **Tier 1** advice and requests that approval be considered effective **April 1, 2025.**

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a response or protest,



please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. Cities and counties requiring Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division within the 20-day protest period so a late-filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on. The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

<u>Replies</u>: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Water Division within 5 business days after the end of the protest period and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response. If you have not



received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact California Water Service Company at (408) 367-8200 and ask for the Rates Department.

ORDINANCE NO. 648

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY, A CORPORATION, ITS SUC-CESSORS AND ASSIGNS, A FRANCHISE TO LAY, CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN, REPAIR AND OPERATE A SYSTEM OF WATER PIPELINES AND OTHER AP-PARATUS IN, OVER, ALONG, ACROSS, UNDER, THROUGH AND UPON CERTAIN PUBLIC STREETS, ROADS ALLEYS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE COMP ROADS, ALLEYS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE CITY OF SAN CARLOS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, FOR THE TRANSPORTATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FOR SALE AND DISTRIBUTION FOR DOMESTIC, AGRICULTURAL, INDUSTRIAL, COMMERCIAL AND OTHER LAWFUL USES AND PURPOSES USES AND PURPOSES.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CARLOS COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COM-PANY, a corporation, duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of California, and duly qualified and authorized to transact a public utility business within said State, on the 8th day of August, 1967, filed with this Council, the Council of the City of San Carlos, County of San Mateo, State of California, a written application for the franchise hereinafter set forth;

WHEREAS, said application was made under and in conformity with the laws of the State of California pertaining to the granting of franchises by City authorities, Statutes 1905, page 777, as amended, and under the provisions of Chapter 1, Division 3 of the Public Utilities Code of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, this Council, in the exercise of its discretion, did, by resolution duly and regularly adopted at a regular meeting thereof held on the 28th day of August, 1967, propose to grant such franchise upon the terms, conditions and restrictions imposed and required by law, and resolved that it would receive sealed bids for such fran-chise, all such bids to be delivered to the Clerk of this Council, viz., the City Clerk of said City of San Carlos, at his office in the City of San Carlos, up to the 9th day of October, 1967, at the hour of 2:00 o'clock P.M., and that thereupon at said time and at the regular meeting room of the Council in said office, said bids would be opened and said franchise struck off, sold and awarded by this Council to the person, firm or corporation making the highest cash bid therefor; and

WHEREAS, this Council by the aforesaid resolution fixed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) as the penal sum of the bond to be filed by the successful bidder for said franchise within a reasonable time after the awarding of said franchise to said successful bidder; and

WHEREAS, this Council did, by the aforesaid resolution, order and direct that there be published in the Redwood City Tribune, a daily newspaper of general circulation in said City of San Carlos, once a day for ten (10) successive days, commencing on the 5th day of September, 1967, or as often during said period as said paper is published, notice that said application has been filed and that the Council proposed to grant said franchise to the highest bidder, all as required by Chapter 1, Division 3, of the Public Utilities Code of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds that said notice has been duly published in said Redwood City Tribune in the manner and for the period required by law, and that said publication was completed not less than twenty (20) nor more than thirty (30) days before any further action on said franchise was taken by this Council; and

WHEREAS, at the time and place aforesaid, said sealed bids were opened, and said franchise was struck off, sold and awarded, by this Council to CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY, a California corporation, the

TER SERVICE COMPANY, a California corporation, the person, firm or corporation who made the highest cash bid therefor in the manner provided by said Chapter 1, Division 3, of said Public Utilities Code; and WHEREAS, said CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY, a California corporation, in the manner and within the time provided by said Chapter 1, Division 3, of within the time provided by said Chapter 1, Division 3, of said Public Utilities Code, has deposited and paid the full

amount of its said bid; and
WHEREAS, said CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE
COMPANY, a California corporation, on the 18th day of
October, 1967, filed with this Council a bond, conditioned according to law, running to said City of San Carlos, in the penal sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), being the amount heretofore fixed by this Council as the penal sum of said bond, which said bond was a good and suffi-cient bond and was in all respects as required by law and was thereupon and heretofore and is hereby approv-

ed by this Council;
NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY Attest:
OF SAN CARLOS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF KATHLEEN M. GRANT

CALIFORNIA, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COM-PANY, a California corporation, its successors and as-

signs, is hereby gra in the right, privilege and franchise, to lay, construm aintain, repair and operate a system of water pipelines and other apparatus for the transportation and distribution of water for sale and distribution for domestic, agricultural, industrial, commercial and other lawful uses and purposes in, over, along, across, under, through and upon the public streets, roads, alleys and highways within that portion of the City of San Carlos, County of San Mateo, State of California, presently served by said CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY and within that portion of said City to which CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY has dedicated or may in the future dedicate its service. or may in the future dedicate its service.

Section 2. All pipes and necessary appliances and fixtures used in connection with said system shall be laid, constructed, maintained and removed in conformity with law. Whenever it is proposed by the grantee of this franchise to open the public highways, streets and alleys of the said City of San Carlos, the said grantee shall serve notice upon the Street Superintendent of said City of San Carlos, a reasonable length of time prior to commencing the said operation. Nothing herein shall be construed to mean that the said grantee need secure approval of any such operation, provided that reasonable regulations may be imposed by the said Street Superintendent to protect the public of the said City of San Carlos. Where emergency operations are indicated by circumstances beyond the control of this grantee, notice need not be delivered to the said Street Superintendent prior to remedial action being taken.

Section 3. Said grantee, and its successors and assigns, shall at all times keep said water pipeline system and all accessory appliances and fixtures used in connection with said system in good order and condition, provided that if damage should result to the ground and road surfaces thereover, the grantee shall repair the same immediately.

Section 4. Said franchise shall commence on the ef fective date hereof and shall continue and endure in full force and effect until voluntarily surrendered or abandoned by said grantee, its successors or assigns,, with the consent of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California, or until all property used and useful in the exercise of said franchise and situated within the territorial limits of the City of San Carlos shall be transferred to the State of California, or some municipal or public corporation pursuant to voluntary agreement or the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or until said franchise shall be forfeited for noncompliance with its terms by said grantee.

Section 5. Said grantee, its successors and assigns, must, commencing July 1, 1967, and continuing during the life of said franchise, pay annually to said City of San Carlos, two per cent (2%) of the gross annual receipts arising from the use, operation or possession of said franpayable annually on or before the first day of April of each year with respect to the gross annual receipts for the preceding calendar year, the first payment to be made on or before April 1, 1968 with respect to the gross re-ceipts for the six month period ending December 31, 1967. In the event that any such payment is not made, said

franchise shall be forfeited. Section 6. Payment by said grantee of said sums specified in Section 5 hereof shall be in lieu of any business license tax or other similar charge or levy now or hereafter imposed upon said grantee by said City of San Carlos and said grantee shall have no obligation to pay any such tax, charge or levy referable to the fiscal year com-mencing July 1, 1967 or any year thereafter during the life of said franchise.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after thirty (30) days from its passage, and, before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage, this ordinance shall be published once, with the names of the members of this Council voting for and against this ordinance, in the San Carlos Enquirer, a newspaper of general circulation published in said City of San Carlos.

Introduced this 9th day of October, 1967.
